1	[Work Group Citizens Advisory Committee for Natural Areas Program.]

3	Resolution establishing a Board of Supervisors Work Group Citizens Advisory
4	<u>Committee</u> for the Recreation and Park Natural Areas Program.
5	
6	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors recognizes the need and the responsibility for
7	public input and public discussion regarding the use of City resources; and
8	WHEREAS, The City's parkland and open space are among the most precious and
9	most valued of City resources, intended for the use of all San Franciscans and not to be
10	alienated or divested from them, or to be changed in use or access without full public
11	disclosure, comment, and process; and
12	WHEREAS, The Recreation and Park Department has not fulfilled its responsibilities to
13	ensure public and open process with regard to the Natural Areas Program, as was required in
14	the Recreation and Park Department's own documentation in both 1995 and 1997; and
15	WHEREAS, Legitimate concerns regarding access to and use of open space were
16	raised at the Board of Supervisors Neighborhood Services and Recreation Committee
17	Hearing on the Natural Areas Program, held July 11, 2002; and
18	WHEREAS, The activities of the Recreation and Park Department Natural Areas
19	Program have exceeded the permitted mandate even of the Recreation and Park Department
20	itself, and have ignored both public process and public policy with, for example, the cutting
21	down of mature and healthy trees in San Francisco City parks and open spaces without
22	notice to citizens, proper process, or opportunity for response; and
23	WHEREAS, The Natural Areas Program is being expanded to include more staff and
24	more activities through Open Space funding paid for by the people of the City and County of
25	San Francisco; and

1	WHEREAS, The concept and extent of Natural Areas are being expanded in
2	Recreation and Park documentation, definitions and actions to include corridors, buffer
3	zones, "naturalistic" areas, and areas which have the potential to be restored or to provide
4	habitat; and
5	WHEREAS, At the August 6, 2002 meeting of the Rules and Audits Committee, strong
6	public support was shown for the creation of a Board of Supervisors Work Group that would
7	include groups excluded from the Recreation and Park Department's Green Ribbon Panel;
8	<u>and</u>
9	WHEREAS, The Rules and Audits Committee has sought a compromise solution that
10	would result in a single, balanced committee under the Board with greater scope and duration
11	than the Work Group or the Green Ribbon Panel; and
12	WHEREAS, the Recreation and Park Department expressed its willingness to disband
13	the Green Ribbon Panel and to have a Board Advisory Committee to oversee the Natural
14	Areas Program and planning process; now, therefore, be it
15	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors establish forthwith a Work Group for the
16	Recreation and Park Natural Areas Program, Natural Areas Program Citizens Advisory
17	Committee (NAPCAC) to report and make recommendations directly to the Board of
18	Supervisors; and, be it
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the General Manager of the Recreation and Park
20	Department has agreed to disband the Green Ribbon Panel and have its duties assumed by
21	NAPCAC within its broader mandate; and, be it
22	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Work Group NAPCAC shall include among its
23	members representatives of communities living in the areas already or slated to be
24	designated as Natural Areas, as well as representatives of relevant scientific, ecological and
25	recreational interests; and, be it

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Recreation and Park Department shall assist the
2	Work Group NAPCAC with input from its staff as required by the Committee, including giving
3	notice of meetings, providing meeting space, and publishing minutes; and, be it
4	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Recreation and Park Department shall assist the
5	Work Group NAPCAC by providing to each member a copy of the "Significant Natural
6	Resource Areas Management Plan," prepared by EIP Associates; and, be it
7	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors Work Group for the
8	Recreation and Park Natural Areas Program shall consist of one representative designated
9	by each of the following groups and organizations:

12	California Native Plant Society
13	Coalition for San Francisco Neighborhoods

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That NAPCAC shall have 22 members, consisting of eleven
2	(11) members chosen by San Francisco Recreation and Park Department and one
3	representative designated by each of the following eleven (11) groups and organizations
4	which have demonstrated a stakeholder interest in the Natural Areas Program:
5	San Francisco Tree Council
6	<u>SF/SPCA</u>
7	Coalition for San Francisco Neighborhoods
8	Bayview Hill Neighborhood Association
9	Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Advisory Committee
10	Glen Canyon Park Neighborhood Coalition
11	San Francisco Dog Owners Group
12	Bernal Hill Neighborhood Coalition
13	McLaren Park Habitat Restoration Group
14	Tank Hill Neighbors
15	CITYDOGS of San Francisco
16	Replacements, if needed, to RPD's appointees shall be chosen by RPD, and replacements
17	to the above non-RPD list shall be chosen by the non-RPD appointing group or organization;
18	and, be it
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the President of the Board of Supervisors shall have the
20	authority to expand the membership of the Work Group by up to two additional members,
21	each representing one additional organization; and, be it
22	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Work Group NAPCAC shall be subject to the
23	Sunshine Ordinance; and, be it

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the mandate of the Board of Supervisors Work Group for
2	the Recreation and Park Natural Areas Program NAPCAC shall include, but not be limited to,
3	consideration and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on the following:
4	Effective means of eliciting public input from neighborhood groups and individuals
5	regarding appropriate use of City parkland and open space;
6	Recognition and documentation of community needs, concerns and preferences
7	regarding use of City parkland and open space;
8	Approaches to the creation, maintenance and prioritization of Natural Areas;
9	Examination of present Natural Areas Program activities;
10	Examination of the content and intent of the "Significant Natural Resource Areas
11	Management Plan," prepared by EIP Associates, and of the consequences of carrying
12	out the recommendations therein;
13	Possible and actual costs of the Natural Areas Program, thus far and over time,
14	particularly in relation to the many other recreational responsibilities of the Recreation
15	and Park Department;
16	Examination of the requirements for CEQA in relation to the implementation of Natural
17	Area Program projects, and the consequences and appropriateness of permitting
18	exemptions to CEQA requirements in any given case; and, be it
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That NAPCAC shall be an Advisory Committee to the Board
20	of Supervisors; and, be it
21	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors Work Group for the Natural
22	Areas Program NAPCAC shall report its findings, concerns and recommendations in writing to
23	the Board, serially or in total, as and when it deems appropriate and necessary; and, be it

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the timetable for bringing the Natural Areas Managemen
2	Plan forward for Public Comment would be extended to a minimum of one year from the first
3	meeting of NAPCAC instead of the currently scheduled six months; and, be it
4	FURTHER RESOLVED, That until the Natural Areas Management Plan is completed
5	and approved by the Board of Supervisors, the Natural Areas Program may continue to
6	preserve and maintain genuine remnants of San Francisco's native flora and fauna so long as
7	those activities do not include:
8	Removal of healthy trees that pose no safety hazard
9	Trail closures, or restrictions on access and recreation
10	Trapping and removal of wild or feral animals currently inhabiting parks and lakes
11	Expansion of activities into areas that no longer support predominantly native flora and
12	fauna; and, be it
13	FURTHER RESOLVED, That if the Board of Supervisors determines that NAPCAC is
14	not fulfilling its purpose of providing balanced oversight and neighborhood involvement in
15	the Natural Areas Program and planning process, it shall be the policy of the Board to
16	disband NAPCAC and consider the establishment of a Board of Supervisors Work Group,
17	as presented in File No. 021260. and, be it
18	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Work Group shall sunset two years from the date of
19	its creation, unless otherwise amended.
