






Commercial Corridors: Vandalism 2020



Top 10 Impacted Corridors: Vandalism YTD 2021 (Jan- Oct)





Commercial Corridors : Burglaries 2019




Commercial Corridors: Burglaries 2020



Top 10 Impacted Corridors: Burglary YTD 2021 (Jan- Oct)




For all three years, the Central Market Corridor experienced over 50 burglary incidents. Since 2019, there has been an increase in incidents, with 2021 likely increasing as well.

Commercial Corridors: Robberies 2019




Commercial Corridors: Robberies 2020



Top 10 Impacted Corridors: Robberies YTD 2021 (Jan- Oct)



For all three years, the Central Market Corridor experienced over 50 robbery incidents, surpassing the other 24 identified commercial corridors throughout San Francisco.



The Central District experienced the most incidents from 2019 to YTD 2021 (Jan – Oct) with 2201 theft incidents followed by the Tenderloin District with 837 incidents.



The Department contracts with the Language Line vendor that provides the Insight application used for interpretation services in all languages, including American Sign Language (ASL). SFPD represent over 30 languages besides the five languages identified by the San Francisco Department of Human Resources (SFDHR)--Cantonese, Mandarin, Russian, Spanish, and Tagalog.
