[Urging A Death Penalty Moratorium]

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO APPROVE LEGISLATION PROVIDING A MORATORIUM ON CARRYING OUT THE DEATH PENALTY.

WHEREAS, Since 1973, during the same period that 628 executions were carried out, 87 wrongly convicted men and women on death row have been cleared; and,

WHEREAS, This is an error rate of 1 innocent person for every 7 persons executed; and,

WHEREAS, A comprehensive new study by Columbia Law School of every capital conviction between 1973-1995 found that serious mistakes were made in 2/3 of all capital cases; and,

WHEREAS, There are racial disparities in the application of the death penalty with African-Americans accounting for 35% of those executed, 43% of those on death row nationwide, and 67% of those on death row in the Federal system although African-Americans constitute only 13% of the American population; and,

WHEREAS, At least 17 city and county governments have passed resolutions supporting a moratorium on executions; and,

WHEREAS, H.R. 4162, the Accuracy in Judicial Administration Act of 2000, would assure protection for the substantive due process rights of the innocent by providing a temporary moratorium on carrying out the death penalty to assure that persons able to prove their innocence are not executed; and,

WHEREAS, S. 2463, the National Death Penalty Moratorium Act of 2000, would immediately suspend executions in the United States while a national, blue ribbon panel reviews the administration of the death penalty and policies ensuring justice, fairness, and due process are implemented; and,

WHEREAS, H.R. 4162 and S. 2463 are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_\_; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco endorses a moratorium on executions in the United States and urges the United States Congress to approve legislation providing a moratorium on carrying out the death penalty; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from California in Congress, with a request they take all action necessary to achieve the objectives of this resolution.
