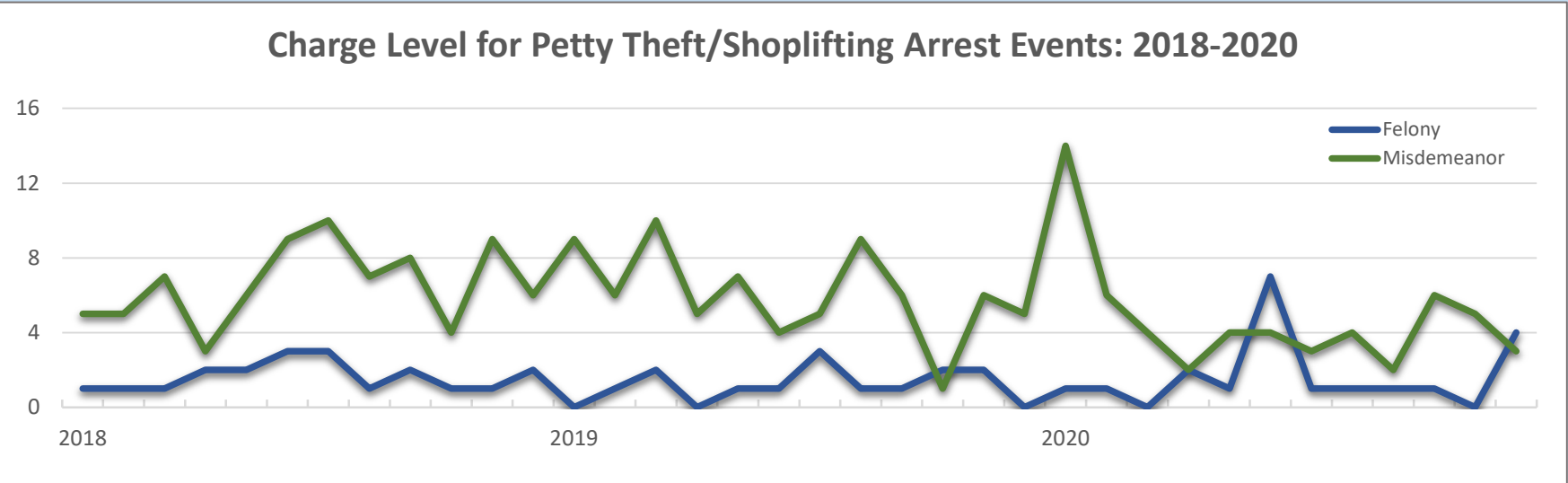

APD Conducts Review of All New Arrests –

- Seriousness of the new alleged criminal conduct
- Seriousness of underlying offense
- Compliance with Terms and Conditions of Supervision
 - ✓ Engagement in services
 - ✓ Reporting as directed
 - ✓ Prior Motions to Revoke
- Victim Safety
- Graduated Sanctions

Graduated Sanctions:

- Reduce Recidivism
- Reduce Harm to the Community
- Enhance Public Safety
- Improve Client Success and Accountability
- Minimize Use of Formal Court Actions – Intermediate Options
- Achieve Greater Agency-Wide Consistency
- Target Resources Effectively and Efficiently

Graduated Sanctions:

- Increased Reporting to Probation Officer
- Increased Drug Testing
- Community Service Hours
- Increased Services – Education, Counseling, Employment, Housing
- Case Management Services
- Increased Searches
- Home Detention with Electronic Monitoring
- Flash Incarceration (PRCS Clients)
- More Intensive Treatment/Services
- Cognitive Behavioral Treatment
- Transfer to Higher Level of Supervision
- Arrest – Return to Court on Motion to Revoke Probation
- Custodial Sanctions
