

1 [Contract Amendment - Addiction, Research & Treatment, Inc. dba BAART - Opioid
2 Dependent Substance Abuse Treatment and Education Services - Not to Exceed
3 \$98,283,105]

4 **Resolution approving Amendment No. 1 to the agreement between Addiction, Research**
5 **& Treatment, Inc. dba BAART and the Department of Public Health (DPH), to provide**
6 **opioid dependent substance abuse treatment and education services, to increase the**
7 **agreement by \$62,331,105 for an amount not to exceed \$98,283,105; to extend the term**
8 **by five years, from June 30, 2022, for a total agreement term of July 1, 2018, through**
9 **June 30, 2027, with one one-year option to extend at the City’s sole and absolute**
10 **discretion; and to authorize DPH to enter into amendments or modifications to the**
11 **contract prior to its final execution by all parties that do not materially increase the**
12 **obligations or liabilities to the City and are necessary to effectuate the purposes of the**
13 **contract or this Resolution.**

15 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health (DPH), selected Addiction, Research &
16 Treatment, Inc. dba BAART (BAART) through a Request for Proposals (RFP) process, RFP
17 26-2016, issued on September 27, 2016, to provide opioid dependent substance abuse
18 treatment and education services for adult residents of San Francisco under an agreement
19 with an initial term of four years, July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2022, and not to exceed
20 amount of \$35,952,000; and

21 WHEREAS, A copy of the original agreement approved by the Board of Supervisors for
22 the term of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2022, for a total contract amount not to exceed
23 \$35,952,000, is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors through Resolution No.250-
24 18 (File No. 180561); and

1 WHEREAS, DPH wishes to amend the agreement to continue providing opioid
2 dependent substance abuse treatment and education services for adult residents of San
3 Francisco by extending the term by five years, from June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2027,
4 increasing the contract by \$62,331,105 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$98,283,105
5 and for a total agreement term of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2027; and

6 WHEREAS, Section 9.118 of the Charter requires approval of the Board of Supervisors
7 for contracts requiring anticipated expenditures exceeding \$10 million; now, therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Public
9 Health and the Director of the Office of Contract Administration/Purchaser, on behalf of the
10 City and County of San Francisco, to execute Amendment No. 1 to the agreement with
11 BAART to provide opioid dependent substance abuse treatment and education services for
12 adult residents of San Francisco, to extend the term by five years, from June 30, 2022,
13 through June 30, 2027, increasing the contract by \$62,331,105, for a total contract amount not
14 to exceed \$98,283,105, and for a total agreement term of July 1, 2018, through June 30,
15 2027, with one one-year option to extend at the City's sole and absolute discretion; and, be it

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of
17 Public Health to enter into any amendments or modifications to the contract, prior to its final
18 execution by all parties, that the Department determines, in consultation with the City
19 Attorney, are in the best interests of the City, do not otherwise materially increase the
20 obligations or liabilities of the City, are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of
21 the contract, and are in compliance with all applicable laws; and be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the contract being fully executed
23 by all parties, the Director of Health and/or the Director of the Office of Contract
24 Administration/Purchaser shall provide the final contracts to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion
25 into the official File No. 220418.
