3	Resolution urging Congress to approve \$200 million for the Samaritan Initiative to
4	implement housing and supportive services strategies to end chronic homelessness.

6	WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco is committed to ending chronic
7	homelessness in San Francisco; and
8	WHEREAS, chronically homeless individuals—those who struggle with the most
9 10	persistent forms of homelessness— are sometimes afflicted not only by poverty but also by
10	chronic conditions such as mental illness and substance abuse; and
12	WHEREAS, housing for the chronically homeless is most effective when supportive
12	services regarding physical health, substance abuse, and mental health problems are offered
13	in tandem with housing; and
14	WHEREAS, significant research has demonstrated that supportive housing models to
16	end chronic homelessness can be highly effective and that the cost of such housing is
17	substantially offset by savings to expensive systems of community care including
18	hospitalization and incarceration; and
19	WHEREAS, the abolition of chronic homelessness requires collaboration and
20	coordination at all levels of government, together with community institutions, businesses, and
20	neighborhood and faith-based organizations, to determine how best to implement prevention
22	and intervention strategies; and
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors
24	urges Congress to pass the \$200 million multi-federal agency budget proposal for the
25	

1	Samaritan Initiative for the 2005-06 federal budget, which will help cities implement housing
2	and supportive services strategies to end chronic homelessness; and
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco supports an
4	increased investment of at least \$45 million to be included in the federal government's
5	Projects of Regional and National Significance for the Ending Long Term Homelessness
6	Service Initiative to increase on-site supportive services of the Samaritan Initiative.
