Resolution authorizing the Department of Parking and Traffic to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$360,000 from the Hazard Elimination Safety Program to implement an emergency vehicle priority system at the 20 to 30 most critical intersections surrounding the five busiest fire stations in the City – the Financial District, Chinatown, Moscone Center, Civic Center and Mission Bay.

WHEREAS, the Hazard Elimination Safety (HES) Program was established by the Transportation Efficiency Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) of 1998 to provide funds for safety improvements on local roads; and,

WHEREAS, The implementation of permanent emergency vehicle priority systems would result in a reduction of emergency vehicle response time, enhancement of road safety and sharing of priority systems by local and regional emergency services and local transit agencies; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco is one of the few cities in the United States without emergency vehicle priority technology; and,

WHEREAS, Implementation of the priority system would include traffic signal modifications by DPT and upgrading of emergency vehicles by the SFFD; and

WHEREAS The Department of Parking and Traffic has received \$360,000 (90% of total project costs) in HES program funding with a required local match of \$40,000 (10% of total project costs); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Transportation or his designee to accept and expend\$360,000 in grant funding from the Hazard Elimination Safety Program to implement emergency vehicle priority systems at the 20 to 30 most critical
