I have served the medical cannabis patient community as an activist for thirteen years. I served for 2 years as an elected member of the national Board of Directors of Students for Sensible Drug Policy (SSDP), and I co-founded the SSDP chapter at the University of California Hastings College of the Law in San Francisco. In this role I received the 2010 Student Activist Award from the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws (NORML)

Business and/or professional experience:

For 2.5 years, I have worked as an Of Counsel with Greenbridge Corporate Counsel, practicing business law exclusively for clients in California's legal medical cannabis industry. Our clients include medical cannabis collectives that provide medical cannabis to patients in SF, and ancillary companies that provide other related products and services in this industry. Prior to Greenbridge, I served for 3 years as the executive director of the Rhode Island Patient Advocacy Coalition (RIPAC), organizing the medical cannabis patient community for compassionate legislation that overcame three gubernatorial vetoes. In this role I received the August 2007 High Times Magazine Freedom Fighter of the Month award.

Civic Activities:

I also serve as an anti-racist social-justice advocate with the longstanding SF-based non-profit organization Legal Services for Prisoners with Children (LSPC). In this role I assisted with the passage of the Fair Chance Ordinance (2014 enactment 017-14), initially sponsored by Supes. Kim and Cohen, to reduce the structural discrimination faced by formerly incarcerated people in the contexts of employment and housing; this ordinance was passed unanimously by the Board of Supervisors and signed by Mayor Lee. For this work with the Fair Chance Campaign we jointly received a HERO Award for Organizations Advancing Civil Rights from the SF Human Rights Commission, and a Certificate of Honor from the Board of Supervisors.

In each of these fields, Erich proudly represents the best of the cannabis industry. From providing free medicine to low income seriously ill patients in the 1990s, to serving on the board of the National Cannabis Industry Association (NCIA) since its inception in 2010, Erich has run the gamut of the cannabis community. Erich's contribution to the cannabis community has raised the bar for the industry while empowering countless individual patients, operators, entrepreneurs, and industry lumineers.

Seeing a dire need for those patients living with HIV/AIDS, in 2001 Erich Pearson co-founded the San Francisco Cannabis Collective. Hello.

The purpose of this communication is to express interest in the Cannabis State Legalization Task Force, and to apply for a seat at the table.

My name is Brent Saupe and I currently work as a San Francisco Bay Area medical cannabis cultivation and construction consultant for no cost to low income patients, as well as helping coordinate, build and operate larger dispensing and nondispensing collective gardens.'

I have been teaching others to grow their own medical cannabis, introducing patients to gardeners, and helping to facilitate compliant sustainable collective gardens for over 15 years. I have personally been growing my own cannabis for over 30 years. An experimental San Francisco collective garden that I coordinated called Potspace, was declared by the SFWeekly to be "the best place for someone else to grow your own" in 2011.

As an ex-general contractor, I have been able to help numerous patients set up safe and legally compliant gardens in San Francisco. Building codes and city planning are just as important when considering growing cannabis in San Francisco, as knowing what law enforcement concerns are. Having experienced seven medical cannabis garden raids personally over the last fifteen years, and being "caught" following the rules each time. I have the experience, and perspective necessary to contribute to this conversation in a way that should help create continued success and compliance in San Francisco for cannabis users, law enforcement, and the building dept. alike.

Seeing the importance in working to create reasonable garden guidelines that are easy for patients and law enforcement to understand, I volunteered as a member of the San Francisco Medical Cannabis Task Force, and numerous sub-committees, where we held hearings, collected public input from professionals in the field, as well as from community members, in order to create reports and give recommendations to the Board of Supervisors concerning medical cannabis issues.

I have worked with a variety of cannabis reform and community action groups including: Americans For Safe Access (ASA) since 2002, giving legal trainings and as a peer counselor in dispensaries, and in public forums teaching members how to comply with the law and how to reduce the potential harm that may occur during law enforcement encounters. I also have volunteered with the San Francisco chapter of ASA since 2002 where I helped facilitate meetings, coordinate volunteers, create fund raising opportunities, planned emergency raid responses, and rallied patients for dispensary/court support. In addition to this, I helped co-found Axis of Love, the most active and involved low income patient focused advocacy group, over a decade ago. And since I have developed a huge love and respect for the members and for the compassionate work they do every day.

I have attended Glad Tidings Church in the Fillmore district for over 15 years, where I've served as a board member, teacher, handyman and janitor. I also spent two years in Bible school, and worked in inner city and low income community's in many different capacities over the last 24 years that I have lived in San Francisco. I feel this gives me an inclusive perspective of a large group of San Franciscans who may feel underrepresented during this process.

While not having an active leadership role in these for quite a few years, I have carved out—a unique place of mutual respect and communication with each of the prominent and active San Francisco cannabis organizations, and within the San Francisco faith communities as well, and would offer that because of this, I would be a helpful addition to this task force in gathering community input in a fair and amicable fashion, and crafting reasonable rules for San Franciscans in the upcoming months as we prepare for legalization.

I am qualified to fill seat 9, seat 11, or seat 12.

Thank you for considering me for each of these positions, I enjoy being able to serve my community, and to do it in this way would be a joy.

Ryan Hudson is a seasoned entrepreneur with an engineering and technical background. He is a co-founder of The Apothecarium, a medical cannabis dispensary based in SF's Castro neighborhood. The Apothecarium provides safe access to lab-tested medical cannabis in a clean, professional environment. I am a small business owner who continues to struggle to remain in San Francisco as rents grow ever higher. As a co-founder of a merchant + neighbor organization, I am keenly aware of the difference of magnitude between what other merchants make and can afford for rent and what cannabis clubs make. As a small business owner, I want to make sure that our streets are cleaner, and that cannabis is taxed at a rate that maximizes revenue to the city, while not encouraging people to take a lower taxed product. I also am very concerned as a Mom with two male children in their teens, that the legislation not push our most vulnerable, those whose brains are still developing, to continue to use the illicit market.

Civic Activities:

In addition to my work in my community over the years, I know that cannabis clubs can benefit neighborhoods and be good neighbors, and they can, like any other business, be bad neighbors. I believe we can do a better job of culling the good from the bad and making it more possible to get rid of the bad. On the flip side after 6+ months on the task force, I'm concerned about how we are going to distribute recreational cannabis as stores are limited to a tiny squeezed green zone. I think that we are going to be seeing lots of delivery services and we should be thinking about how to do that in a way that benefits rather than harms our City.

I am also City College of San Francisco Vice President of the Board of Trustees. As such, I know how little revenue there is in CA for education. I would like to see some of the revenue raised from cannabis sales, medical or recreational, go towards education so that our system can continue to be strong with a new revenue source. Dear San Francisco Rules Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to apply for Seats 9, 11, 12 & 21 on the Cannabis Legalization Task Force. As a native of San Francisco, and an advocate for medical cannabis since 2001, I would like to offer my knowledge and expertise to develop sound and sensible policies for the City of San Francisco.

Prior to be involved in medical cannabis, I worked as an in home care provider for mentally and physically disabled patient's, and as a chiropractic assistant in a small clinic in Potrero Hill. I was in a motor vehicle accident, four months after graduating from SF City College at the age of 18, where I was later diagnosed with fibromyalgia, leaving me with a range of symptoms including nerve damage, pain, chronic fatigue, & IBS. In my quest of healing, I tried dozens of medications and visited over 30 medical professionals and specialists to help ease my pain. Nothing has provided me the relief that cannabis has been able to offer.

As an advocate of medical cannabis, I was one of the founding members of the San Francisco Chapter of ASA(Americans for Safe Access). I received a patient advocacy award in Washington DC in 2013 for years of work in this industry. My work experience includes Office Manager of Compassionate Health Options medical cannabis clinics, Northern California Liaison for Americans for Safe Access, Politics & History teacher at Oaksterdam University, and legal assistant for two cannabis defense attorneys.

I'm confident that I can contribute a balanced and well rounded prospective based on the following:

- I'm a mother of two children: ages 5 and 8 years old
- I was born and raised in San Francisco graduating from (bi-lingual) schools in the Mission district, and Hunters Point
- I have been a neighbor to an active dispensary (Re-leaf Center)
- I depend on medicinal cannabis for my own quality of life
- I have a good understanding of the hurdles medical cannabis dispensaries face: banking issues, federal interference, permitting & zoning issues, neighbor disputes, records,
- My interest has always been how to better serve the needs of patients
- My goal is for San Francisco to continue to set a model for the nation to follow (as we have on the past, on so many issues)

I have serious concerns about the legalization structures that have been implemented in other states. Washington passed zero tolerance DUI laws, that make it illegal to drive with cannabis in your system. The last thing we want to do is create a system that further criminalizes activity that is considered legal. Colorado was another good example of what we do not want to replicate in California, in order to prepare for the first day of cannabis sales January 1st, there was a one time transfer of any amount of medicine from the Medical cannabis program to the recreational cannabis program. This essentially means that patients who depend on cannabis for quality of life, gifted thousands of pounds of cannabis to recreational users to get high and make money. The consequence is the patients who need this most, who may not be able to afford the medicine they need, are the ones suffering while others make money. These models should be lessons for us.

Qualifications for the following Seats:

Seat 9: I have worked and volunteered in the cannabis industry for over 13 years in Northern California, with professional experience working for an attorney, doctor, and the largest grassroots organization supporting medical cannabis, Americans for Safe Access.

Seat 11: I use a range of cannabis products to relive my symptoms related to fibromyalgia which I was diagnosed following a MVA in Golden Gate Park, in 2000. My interest in being a voice during medical cannabis legalization is to ensure that patients rights are preserved and that we work towards a system that does not criminalize patients based on quality of life needs.

Seat 12: I have been a cannabis advocate for over a decade in San Francisco, working with San Francisco ASA & Medical Cannabis Task Force (as well as the working group that created the task force), my exposure to cannabis in San Francisco began as early as middle school, I can contribute balanced solutions based on a range of experiences in San Francisco.

Seat 21: While I consider myself no public policy expert, I have worked at the local, state, and federal level to help develop ordinances, bills, and congressional solutions to our current hurdles on medical cannabis. Working towards sensible regulation I have had the opportunity to work with city councils, board of supervisors, sheriff, narcotics, department of public health, planning departments, and retired politicians. *Americans for Safe Access*, working in alliance with *American Herbal Products Association* (the regulatory agency for all medicinal plants & herbs) have developed a monograph, and standards for distribution, manufacturing, testing, and cultivation. I support AHPA's regulation and look forward to any steps that may remove cannabis from the Controlled Substance Act. I recognize our current legal system unequally affects low income individuals and people of of color.

As a patient born and raised in San Francisco, my interest is to maintain good standards, as San Francisco has always served as a model for the nation.

Board Qualifications:

The Cannabis State Legalization Task Force (Task Force) was established to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and other City departments on matters relating to the potential legalization of cannabis so that the policymakers are fully prepared to address policy questions through legislation and administrative actions, following the adoption of a State law.

The Task Force consists of 22 members (seats 1 through 7 shall be non-voting members):

DEPARTMENT HEAD MEMBERS

- > Seat 1: Director of the Department of Public Health, or his/her designee
- > Seat 2: Chief of the Fire Department, or his/her designee
- > Seat 3: Chief of the Police Department, his/her designee
- > Seat 4: Director of the Department of Building Inspection, or his/her designee
- > Seat 5: Director of Planning, or his/her designee
- > Seat 6: Executive Director of the Entertainment Commission, or his/her designee
- > Seat 7: Executive Director of the California Board of Equalization, or his/her designee (if the Executive Director declines and fails to appoint a designee for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a member of the public)
- > Seat 8: Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District, or his/her designee which may include a Member of the Board of Education (if the Superintendent declines and fails to appoint a designee for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a member of the public)

PUBLIC MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

- > Seat 9: Must be an individual with at least two years of experience working in the cannabis industry.
- > Seat 10: Must be an owner or operator of a medical cannabis dispensary.
- > Seat 11: Must be an individual who uses cannabis for medicinal purposes and has at least two years of cannabis legalization advocacy experience.
- > Seat 12: Must be an individual who uses cannabis and has at least two years of cannabis legalization advocacy experience.
- > Seat 13: Must be an owner of a small business in San Francisco.
- > Seat 14: Must be an individual with experience working for, or on behalf of, the interests of businesses in San Francisco.
- > Seat 15: Must be an individual with experience working to advance the tourism or hospitality industry in San Francisco.
- > Seats 16 and 17: Must be individuals who represent neighborhood associations.
- > Seat 18: Must be an individual with experience in public health advocacy focusing on drug policy.
- > Seat 19: Must be an individual working in the entertainment or nightlife industry.
- > Seat 20: Must be a representative of a labor union that represents employees working in the cannabis industry.
- > Seat 21: Must be a public policy expert working for an organization focused on the formulation of good public policy.
- > Seat 22: Must be an individual between the ages of 21 and 30 at the time of appointment.

The Public Members in seats 9 through 22 shall serve for a term of one year. The initial term for each seat shall begin on August 31, 2015. At the end of the one-year term, the Board of Supervisors may reappoint the member by written motion without soliciting applications from additional applicants.

The Department of Public Health shall provide clerical and administrative support and staffing for the Task Force. The Task Force shall hold a regular meeting not less than five times per year.

Annual Report: No later than one year after its inaugural meeting, and at least once in the 12 months thereafter, the Task Force shall submit a report to the Board of Supervisors describing the legislative activity in the State Legislature regarding possible legalization of cannabis; findings regarding legal, social, land use, and enforcement issues that are likely to arise in San Francisco if the State adopts proposed legislation through the legislative or electoral process; and recommendations regarding local implementation and enforcement of that potential legislation.
