[Amending Board Rules of Order - Providing Remote Public Comment Opportunities]

3	Motion amending the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order by revising Rule 1.3.3 (In-
4	Person and Remote Public Comment) to provide for remote public comment
5	opportunities for members of the public at committee meetings of the Board.

7	WHEREAS, From the onset of the COVID-19 health emergency in March 2020, until
8	October 2023, the Board of Supervisors ("Board") provided opportunities for members of the
9	public to provide comment remotely, in order to allow for social distancing and reduce health
10	risks; and
11	WHEREAS, The Board finds that remote public comment has allowed for broader
12	participation in the legislative process and has given voice to a diversity of perspectives from
13	across the City; and
14	WHEREAS, Allowing remote public comment will increase participation in Board
15	committee meetings from people who cannot attend such meetings in person for any number
16	of legitimate reasons, such as childcare or eldercare responsibilities, work schedules, lack of
17	resources, or illness; and
18	WHEREAS, Board of Supervisors committees are the proper venue for public hearings
19	of Ordinances and Resolutions before the Board, per City Charter; now, therefore, be it
20	MOVED, That the Board amends the Rules of Order of the Board of Supervisors to
21	revise Rule 1.3.3 and Rule 3.8 to read as follows:

23	1.3.3. In-Person and Remote Public Comment.
24	Where opportunity for public comment is required under 4.19 (Public Hearings on
25	Appeals), and 4.22 (General Public Comment Before the Full Board of Supervisors), members

of the public shall be given the option to comment in-person at a meeting of the Board. Where opportunity for public comment is required under Rules 3.8 (Public Testimony in Committee), members of the public shall be given the option to comment in-person at a meeting of the committee or remotely.

The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall offer opportunities to provide remote public comment to members of the public as necessary to enable the participation of people with disabilities, to the extent required by law. For purposes of this Rule 1.3.3, "remotely" means telephonically or otherwise electronically, as determined by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

## 3.8. Public Comment at Committee Meetings.

Public comment is welcome on any item on committee agendas. Public comment is not provided on other matters, because committees may consider only items which have been referred to the committee and properly posted, published, and noticed. This is the opportunity to hear public testimony for and against proposed legislation pending before the committee. Remote public comment shall be provided to no more than 15 speakers for each item unless that limit is lifted at the beginning of the committee meeting by a majority vote of the committee, pursuant to Rule 3.20 (Applicable Rules). This 15-speaker limit shall not include those speakers who request to participate remotely due to a disability.
