6	December 31, 2025; \$217,444 for the term of January 1, 2026, through December		
7	31, 2026; for a total not to exceed amount of \$652,332 from the California		
8	Governor's Office of Emergency Services for recurring grants that fund the Elder		
9	Abuse Program for the grant term of January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2026		
10	should the parties agree to an amendment as allowed under the provisions of the		
11	grant agreement.		
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13	WHEREAS, The Administrative Code requires City departments to obtain Board		
14	of Supervisors' approval to accept or expend any grant funds (Section 10.170 et seq.);		
15	and		
16	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors provided in Section 11.1 of the		
17	administrative provisions of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance that approval of		
18	recurring grant funds contained in departmental budget submissions and approved in		
19	the budget are deemed to meet the requirements of the Administrative Code regarding		
20	grant approvals; and		
21	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors approved this recurring grant in the Fiscal		
22	Year (FY) 2023-2024 and FY2024-2025 as part of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance;		
23	and		
24	WHEREAS, The department has met the City's requirements for appropriating		
25	grant funds but the granting agency, the California Governor's Office of Emergency		

1	Services (Cal OES) requires separate documentation of the Board's approval of their		
2	specific grant funds; and		
3	WHEREAS, The purpose of the Elder Abuse Program is to enhance the safety of		
4	elder and dependent adult victims/survivors of crime by providing direct services to		
5	victims/survivors and bridging the gap between elder justice service providers and		
6	victim/survivor service providers; and		
7	WHEREAS, The grants do not require an amendment to the Annual Salary		
8	Ordinance; and		
9	WHEREAS, The grants include funds supported by the Victims of Crime Act		
10	Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program that requires match equal to 20% of the total		
11	project budget; the source of matching funds is the Office of the District Attorney's		
12	Office general fund; and		
13	WHEREAS, The grant budgets include provision for indirect costs; now,		
14	therefore, be it		
15	RESOLVED, That should the Office of the District Attorney receive more or less		
16	money than the awarded amount, that the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the		
17	acceptance and expenditure by the Office of the District Attorney of the additional or		
18	reduced money; and, be it		
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors designates the District		
20	Attorney as the authorized signatory of the Office of the District Attorney to enter into		
21	Grant Subaward Agreement for Cal OES Elder Abuse Program and extensions, this		
22	authorization applies to all applicable Grant Subaward Amendments and extensions for		
23	the Cal OES Elder Abuse Program.
