Resolution supporting California State Assembly Bill No. 1165, The California Housing Justice Act, introduced by Assembly Member Mike Gipson, to require the California Department of Housing and Community Development to develop a finance plan to solve homelessness and housing unaffordability, establish the California Housing Justice Fund in the General Fund, and require the Legislature to invest an ongoing annual allocation in the Fund in an amount needed to solve homelessness and housing unaffordability.

WHEREAS, San Franciscans and Californians know that meaningful action is needed to ensure every resident has a safe, stable, and affordable home; and

WHEREAS, Housing affordability is a pressing crisis locally and statewide and is the leading driver of homelessness, rent burden, and housing insecurity; and

WHEREAS, While California's leaders invested major one-time resources in housing and homelessness in recent years via bonds and one-time revenue sources, these investments were not ongoing, fell well short of the scale needed, and were not aligned with a comprehensive plan to deliver housing security to Californians; and

WHEREAS, Ongoing state investments in housing and homelessness account for less than 0.5% of the state's annual budget; and

WHEREAS, Housing affordability significantly impacts the local workforce, including working families and low wage workers, and due to systemic racism disproportionately impacts Black, Indigenous, Immigrant, and People of Color households; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco relies significantly on State funded assistance to contribute to the capital stack needed to advance 100% affordable housing production and preservation projects; and

WHEREAS, California State Assembly Bill No. 1165 (AB 1165) would require the California Department of Housing and Community Development to develop a finance plan to solve homelessness and housing unaffordability, establish the California Housing Justice Fund in the General Fund, and require the Legislature to invest an ongoing annual allocation in the Fund in an amount needed to solve homelessness and housing unaffordability; and

WHEREAS, AB 1165, the California Housing Justice Act, is a bold plan to create and protect affordable housing, keep renters stably housed, provide rental assistance to prevent and end homelessness, and offer support services for people with disabilities to stay in their homes; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco strongly supports California State Assembly Bill No. 1165 and urges the California Legislature and Governor to enact the bill, to build a strategic roadmap to end the housing and homelessness crisis and making the ongoing investments at the scale needed to solve our housing crisis; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the State of California to recognize the importance of dedicated and sustained state funding in meeting the state's affordable housing needs; and, be it
