OPPOSING ELECTRIC RATE INCREASES FOR LOW-INCOME CUSTOMERS, URGING THE

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISION TO SEEK GREATER COMMUNITY INPUT

AND URGING THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO ENHANCE ITS

LOW-INCOME PROGRAMS]

WHEREAS, The California Public Utilities Commission is a constitutionally created State agency charged with regulating providers of essential services such as electricity, natural gas, water, and telecommunications under the general direction of the State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, The California Public Utilities Commission created the blueprint for electric restructuring intent on lowering consumer energy rates; and

WHEREAS, AB 1890 promised consumers a 20% rate reduction, via a mandated 10% automatic reduction and a 10% reduction naturally occurring through competition; and

WHEREAS, San Diego Gas and Electric was the first utility to open up to competition and end a freeze on rates causing San Diegans to pay, on average, a 270% increase in electric rates; and

WHEREAS, Pacific Gas and Electric and Southern California Edison are seeking a consumer "bailout" for their increased wholesale electricity prices; and WHEREAS, The end of the rate freeze is likely to double or triple electric rates and bills; and

WHEREAS, The average low-income consumer pays 10% or more of their total income for energy consumption and needs additional ratepayer assistance and energy efficiency programs to ensure access to affordable electricity; and

WHEREAS, The California Public Utilities Commission has rejected mechanisms to ensure sustained community input; and

WHEREAS, The California Public Utilities Commission has so far failed to devise any effective methods for protecting seniors, working families, disabled, limited-English speakers and the poor from excessive rate increases; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco opposes any electric rate increases for low income customers; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California Public Utilities Commission to seek greater community input when setting policies and establishing programs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California Public Utilities Commission to enhance its low-income programs to ensure that all eligible low-income customers of PG&E have weatherization and are part of the CARE program.
