3	Resolution authorizing the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) to accept and			
4	expend funds in the amount of \$2,218,010 from the State Board of Corrections, from			
5	funds made available under Senate Bill 736 – known as the Juvenile Justice Crime			
6	Prevention Act (JJCPA), for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to			
7	be effective in reducing delinquency.

9	WHEREAS, MOCJ is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency of the county in			
10	administering JJCPA, which provides funds for the county to implement a comprehensive			
11	multi-agency juvenile justice plan; and			
12	WHEREAS, JJCPA requires that the county's local Juvenile Justice Coordinating			
13	Council, whose membership is described in Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions			
14	Code, update its Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan and develop an annual expenditure plan			
15	for CPA 2000; and			
16	WHEREAS, JJCPA also requires that the county Board of Supervisors, and in the case			
17	of a city and county the Mayor, approve the updated Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan and			
18	the JJCPA expenditure plan; and			
19	WHEREAS, the City originally established the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council			
20	through resolution 170-97; and			
21	WHEREAS, the Chief Probation Officer, Gwendolyn Tucker, serves as chair of the			
22	Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council as required by JJCPA and Section 749.22 of the			
23	Welfare and Institutions Code; and

1	WHEREAS, on March 25, 2004 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, chaired by			
2	the Chief Probation Officer, met and recommended to the Board of Supervisors the updated			
3	local action plan and the expenditure plan for the 2004 allocation of the JJCPA grant; and			
4	WHEREAS, all funds provided through JJCPA are for direct services to youth, it is			
5	requested that indirect costs be waived; now, therefore be it			
6	RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes MOCJ to			
7	accept and expend \$2,218,010 from the State Board of Corrections, under JJCPA for			
8	programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing			
9	delinquency; and			
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all interest earned and prior year unexpended			
11	encumbered funds of this grant is appropriated to support approved 2004 JJCPA programs;			
12	and			
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors			
14	has reviewed and approves the county's update to the Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile			
15	Justice Plan; and			
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice			
17	is authorized to sign the application for approval submitted to the Board of Corrections; and			
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco			
19	assures that it has adhered to the requirements of JJCPA and of the Board of Corrections			
20	regarding the submission of the plan; and			
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan has been developed and provided to the			
22	Board of Corrections in a format determined by the Board of Corrections regarding			
23	submission of the Plan; and			
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco, upon			
25	approval from the Board of Corrections, will adhere to the requirements of the JJCPA			

1	regarding the expenditure of JJCPA funds and the submission of required Board of			
2	Corrections reports.
