URGING THE SAN FRANCISCO MUNICIPAL RAILWAY TO SUBMIT
QUARTERLY SAFETY REPORTS ON MAINTENANCE AND CONDITIONS OF
BUSSES AND LIGHT RAIL VEHICLES TO MAYOR AND BOARD OF
SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, In February and June of 1998, The California Highway Patrol performed safety inspections on MUNI's diesel bus yards; and

WHEREAS, One of MUNI's three diesel yards, Kirkland Yard, contained many buses that failed both the February and June inspections; and

WHEREAS, In the June inspection, 20 of 145 buses at Kirkland were inspected, and of those 20, six were pulled from service for problems such as bald tires, failing brakes, and broken lights; and

WHEREAS, Despite these failed safety inspections, neither the Mayor nor any Members of the Board of Supervisors were notified of any safety deficiencies in the operating MUNI fleet; and

WHEREAS, Although MUNI's light rail system was not inspected, the fleet is undergoing significant transition during which safety must be a priority; and

WHEREAS, In light of these safety reports and the necessity of a safe and reliable public transit system, increases in preventative safety measures and oversight are needed; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the San Francisco Municipal Railway to submit quarterly safety reports on maintenance and conditions of busses and light rail vehicles to the Mayor and Members of the Board of Supervisors.
