

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - California Governor's Office of Emergency Services
2 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Program - \$61,437]

3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Police Department to accept and expend a**
4 **grant in the amount of \$61,437 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency**
5 **Services for the Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Program to procure**
6 **ammunition for forensic testing and controlled-substance hand-held Raman**
7 **spectrometers for the Criminology Laboratory for the project period beginning on**
8 **January 1, 2021, and ending on December 31, 2021.**

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10 WHEREAS, The Administrative Code requires City departments to obtain Board of
11 Supervisors' approval to accept or expend any grant funds; and

12 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors provided in the administrative provisions of the
13 Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2021 Annual Appropriation Ordinance that approval of recurring grant
14 funds contained in departmental budget submissions and approved in the FY2020-2021
15 budget are deemed to meet the requirements of the Administrative Code regarding grant
16 approvals; and

17 WHEREAS, The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services that provides
18 grant funds to the Police Department requires documentation of the Board's approval of their
19 specific grant funds (Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Program Grant); and

20 WHEREAS, The Police Department (SFPD) applied for funding from the California
21 Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for the Criminology Laboratory; and

22 WHEREAS, On April 21, 2021, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services
23 (Cal OES) approved SFPD's application in the amount of \$61,437 to procure ammunition for
24 forensic testing and controlled-substance hand-held Raman spectrometers for the
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1 Criminology Laboratory for the project period beginning on January 1, 2021, and ending on
2 December 31, 2021; and

3 WHEREAS, The adopted budget for FY2020-2021 is \$66,286; and

4 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and

5 WHEREAS, The SFPD proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program
6 expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes SFPD to accept and expend the
8 grant of \$61,437 from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES);
9 and, be it

10 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
11 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

12 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Chief of Police,
13 or his designee, to enter into the agreement on behalf of the City and County of San
14 Francisco.

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
