3	Resolution celebrating neighborliness and declaring the week of September 27 through
4	October 5, 2025, as "San Francisco Good Neighbor Week" in the City and County of
5	San Francisco; and reaffirming the City's commitment to establishing strong
6	neighborhoods, reducing loneliness, and leveraging strategic partnerships.

8	WHEREAS, National Good Neighbor Day is an annual celebration on September 28th,
9	first proclaimed by President Jimmy Carter to focus public attention on the importance of
10	neighbors and fostering understanding, respect, and a sense of community; and
11	WHEREAS, People rely on social connections; and research shows that cultivating
12	positive neighbor relationships can develop local leaders, aid in community decision-making,
13	improve emergency preparedness, and create more inclusive communities; and
14	WHEREAS, The strength of San Francisco lies in the diversity, generosity, and
15	resilience of its people, and
16	WHEREAS, Strong neighborhoods are built on everyday acts of care neighbors
17	lending a hand, looking out for one another, providing resources, and working together to
18	build a more connected and compassionate city, and
19	WHEREAS, In 2023, the United States Surgeon General declared loneliness a public
20	health crisis, and today, many people still consider a good neighbor as someone who is quiet
21	and leaves you alone, which has led to more isolation, fewer friendships, and a loneliness
22	epidemic; and
23	WHEREAS, San Francisco has a legacy as a champion in supporting residents and
24	celebrating diversity while recognizing race and class inequities; and

1	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is committed to uplifting initiatives
2	that bring neighbors together and that strengthen the civic fabric of our communities; and
3	WHEREAS, Good Neighbor Week celebrates the spirit of community and encourages
4	residents to take simple actions that build trust, cultivate belonging, and improve quality of life
5	for all; now, therefore, be it
6	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
7	declares the week of September 27, through October 5, 2025, "San Francisco Good Neighbor
8	Week" and encourages celebrations throughout the months of September and October; and,

10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors and the City and County of San
11	Francisco commit to reducing barriers to neighborhood gatherings and events; and, be it
12	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors commends the work of the San
13	Francisco Good Neighbor Week Founding Partners for creating these invaluable opportunities
14	for San Francisco residents to build relationships and experience the rich diversity of our
15	neighborhoods; and, be it

17	residents to participate in Good Neighbor Week events, including community clean-ups,
18	neighborhood potlucks, and block parties taking place across the city; and, be it
