4	Resolution commending the San Francisco Housing Authority for their efforts to
5	increase civic participation among their residents of Public and Section 8 housing.

7	WHEREAS, Throughout calendar year 2002, the San Francisco Housing Authority
8	embarked on a concerted effort to increase civic participation among its residents; and,
9	WHEREAS, The goal of SFHA was to increase the number of residents registered to
10	vote and increase the number of residents who actually cast ballots in the elections; and,
11	WHEREAS, The SFHA included multilingual voter information in its rent statements
12	and mailed a voter registration card to every public housing and Section 8 household, made
13	registration cards available at every property office and posted reminders as elections drew
14	near; and,
15	WHEREAS, The Housing Authority also partnered with the A. Philip Randolph Institute
16	(APRI), the Chinatown Community Development Center (CCDC) and the Chinese American
17	Voter Education Committee (CAVEC) to increase voter registration; and,
18	WHEREAS, Outreach and education efforts focused at family developments—
19	Sunnydale, Potrero Hill, Hunters Point, Alice Griffith and Alemany—that had historically lower
20	voter participation; and,
21	WHEREAS, As a result of their coordinated efforts, voter turnout increased from 211 to
22	729 at the family development, a 244% increase in one year; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby commend the
24	San Francisco Housing Authority for their efforts to increase civic participation among their
25	residents of Public and Section 8 housing.
