Hello,

The purpose of this communication is to express interest in the Cannabis State Legalization Task Force, and to apply for a seat at the table.

My name is Brent Saupe and I currently work as a San Francisco Bay Area medical cannabis cultivation and construction consultant for no cost to low income patients, as well as helping coordinate, build and operate larger dispensing and nondispensing collective gardens.

I have been teaching others to grow their own medical cannabis, introducing patients to gardeners, and helping to facilitate compliant sustainable collective gardens for over 15 years. I have personally been growing my own cannabis for over 30 years. An experimental San Francisco collective garden that I coordinated called Potspace, was declared by the SFWeekly to be "the best place for someone else to grow your own" in 2011.

As an ex-general contractor, I have been able to help numerous patients set up safe and legally compliant gardens in San Francisco. Building codes and city planning are just as important when considering growing cannabis in San Francisco, as knowing what law enforcement concerns are. Having experienced seven medical cannabis garden raids personally over the last fifteen years, and being "caught" following the rules each time, I have the experience, and perspective necessary to contribute to this conversation in a way that should help create continued success and compliance in San Francisco for cannabis users, law enforcement, and the building dept. alike.

Seeing the importance in working to create reasonable garden guidelines that are easy for patients and law enforcement to understand, I volunteered as a member of the San Francisco Medical Cannabis Task Force, and numerous sub-committees, where we held hearings, collected public input from professionals in the field, as well as from community members, in order to create reports and give recommendations to the Board of Supervisors concerning medical cannabis issues.





Dear Supervisors and Ms. Somera –

I write to recommend Kevin Reed of The Green Cross for a seat on the newly-formed Cannabis State  
Legalization Task Force.

***Quick introduction.*** Just as background context, I am a 59 year old man with an MBA, self-employed as a financial management expert. I am grateful that I was afforded the chance to spend my career working with and in support of social and economic justice community-based nonprofit organizations. I am an extraordinarily consistent voter throughout my life (district 11, precinct 1102 although I write to ALL of you as a San Franciscan not just Supervisor Avalos). I have been a San Franciscan for just shy of 20 years on the dot.

***How I've known Kevin and his work.*** I met Kevin in 2004 or so when his networking to find information about the legal parameters around CA medical cannabis dispensaries as approved by ballot measure and the associated tax filings. I have kept in close contact with Kevin and admired his surprisingly formal sense of decorum and manners and his trailblazing work on behalf of medical cannabis access ever since I became aware of all of this.

***Specific items in support.*** Beyond Kevin's wealth of experience and knowledge about the filed, I have several specific "kudos" to describe about how Kevin has done his work that speak to his overall approach, and each item as well as in aggregate, demonstrate Kevin's particular preparation and aptitude for the important work of the Task Force.

- From the inception of **this often fraught emergent area of commerce, Kevin has cooperated in the development of new regulatory frameworks throughout**, whether the matter was zoning and locating dispensaries, regulating content standards, or licensing. By instinct, I'd hazard a guess that he's more of a libertarian, but rather than holding back, he engaged and did his best to see good laws and regulations and procedures be developed and adopted. *Demonstrates willingness to "play nice" and be helpful not disruptive or resistant even when the formalization is not entirely in his own narrow self interest.*
- Some years ago, as I was diagnosed with Type II diabetes, I talked with Kevin about fiber as the best answer to offsetting the glycemic index in many foods (other choices are fats and proteins; hydration always helps). I was not sure if he would know what to do with the idea or have time and bandwidth, but the man wastes no time! When I saw him a short 3 or 4 weeks later he'd already **developed one "edible" aimed at a lower glycemic index** by relying heavily on seeds and nuts (all three of fiber

protein & fat) and a sweetener which was asserting itself as somewhat less glycemic. It was, to my eyes, a stunning demonstration of his responsiveness and social responsibility. Of course he's no fool; it was also a new niche.

- Kevin has risked flak from various allies (“no permanent friends / no permanent enemies) and been on the leading edge of **demanding--and inspecting for--sustainability practices and purity testing of crops** grown by co-op members. Yet another nuts and bolts demonstration of social responsibility, and of developing and testing what is practical by way of standards setting in these areas.
- “Back home” Kevin **owned a restaurant.** He is thus **familiar with food handling requirements** and grasps innately why health departments care about such things well beyond the hygienic standards of most home kitchens. This is not so much germane to the specific work of the Task Force as much as a demonstration that he works for the greater good of all and understands the context of assorted rules, even if he grumbles on a theoretical basis he delivers.
- When there arose **concerns that the gorgeous sweet edibles** just looked too darned tempting and **could be eaten by children** by mistake thereby inappropriately medicating them, Kevin once again sprang into fast action and **completely re-designed his packaging** using very adult muted colors that still looked sharp and distinctive. He did this without resisting, **even though the opaque packaging increased his cost and the overall work required** to monitor freshness and check to ensure no mold formation since no visuals available. Another example of social responsibility in practice.
- I was part of a small group of supporters of The Green Cross’ newish storefront in the **Excelsior** who attended a **meeting of the neighborhood association along with Kevin**--complete with his usual Southern manners and pleasingly surprising insistence on a certain type of propriety required of all Green Cross representatives. This meeting was when the new location was getting final approval, and the neighborhood group was talking through the usual San Francisco mix of genuine concerns and generic NIMBYism. He did not flinch, listened carefully, and much as a victorious Presidential candidate assures the “other side” that s/he is a President of all of us, Kevin assured the neighbors that he was hearing them, and that he and his staff would act on some new items. He also repeated his assurance—as did many of us—of how much safer a block around a Green Cross location is, since he fields his own security staff and 24/7 video monitoring from multiple lenses. I attended this meeting since I live across Mission Street and Alemany in the Mission Terrace neighborhood quite close by The Green Cross storefront. I’ve also kept an eye on the location as I drive by very frequently, and there is a distinct increase in foot traffic and overall people presence, which is always the ultimate urban security system. Demonstrates deep awareness of siting practicalities in one of the most difficult communities in the country with a strong emphasis on neighborhood power.

Thank you for the opportunity to apply for Seats 9, 11, 12 & 21 on the Cannabis Legalization Task Force. As a native of San Francisco, and an advocate for medical cannabis since 2001, I would like to offer my knowledge and expertise to develop sound and sensible policies for the City of *San Francisco*.

Prior to be involved in medical cannabis, I worked as an in home care provider for mentally and physically disabled patient's, and as a chiropractic assistant in a small clinic in Potrero Hill. I was in a motor vehicle accident, four months after graduating from *SF City College* at the age of 18, where I was later diagnosed with fibromyalgia, leaving me with a range of symptoms including nerve damage, pain, chronic fatigue, & IBS. In my quest of healing, I tried dozens of medications and visited over 30 medical professionals and specialists to help ease my pain. Nothing has provided me the relief that cannabis has been able to offer.

As an advocate of medical cannabis, I was one of the founding members of the San Francisco Chapter of ASA(Americans for Safe Access). I received a patient advocacy award in Washington DC in 2013 for years of work in this industry. My work experience includes Office Manager of *Compassionate Health Options* medical cannabis clinics, Northern California Liaison for *Americans for Safe Access*, Politics & History teacher at *Oaksterdam University*, and legal assistant for two cannabis defense attorneys.

I'm confident that I can contribute a balanced and well rounded prospective based on the following:

- I'm a mother of two children: ages 5 and 8 years old
- I was born and raised in San Francisco graduating from (bi-lingual) schools in the Mission district, and Hunters Point
- I have been a neighbor to an active dispensary (Re-leaf Center)
- I depend on medicinal cannabis for my own quality of life
- I have a good understanding of the hurdles medical cannabis dispensaries face: banking issues, federal interference, permitting & zoning issues, neighbor disputes, records,
- My interest has always been how to better serve the needs of patients
- My goal is for San Francisco to continue to set a model for the nation to follow (as we have on the past, on so many issues)

I have serious concerns about the legalization structures that have been implemented in other states. Washington passed zero tolerance DUI laws, that make it illegal to drive with cannabis in your system. The last thing we want to do is create a system that further criminalizes activity that is considered legal. Colorado was another good example of what we do not want to replicate in California, in order to prepare for the first day of cannabis sales January 1<sup>st</sup>, there was a one time transfer of any amount of medicine from the Medical cannabis program to the recreational cannabis program. This essentially means that patients who depend on cannabis for quality of life, gifted thousands of pounds of cannabis to recreational users to get high and make money. The consequence is the patients who need this most, who may not be able to afford the medicine they need, are the ones suffering while others make money. These models should be lessons for us.

Seat 9: I have worked and volunteered in the cannabis industry for over 13 years in Northern California, with professional experience working for an attorney, doctor, and the largest grassroots organization supporting medical cannabis, Americans for Safe Access.







### California State Legalization Task Force Application - Stewart Rhoads

The new San Francisco CSL Task Force will need to accomplish 3 main objectives in fulfilling its mandate:

- I. Protect public safety
  - A. Develop regulations for cannabis production, testing, and sales, edibles especially, in advance of ballot initiative passage.
  - B. Address issues related to product quality control, land use, and building safety.
  - C. Develop protocols preventing children from obtaining cannabis.
- II. Facilitate capture of tax revenues
  - A. Differentiate between adult use and legitimate therapeutic use of medical cannabis by seriously ill individuals for certain conditions only, including HIV/AIDS and cancer.
  - B. Ensure residents and tourists have access to venues for acquisition and consumption.
  - C. Direct revenues to maximize public benefit, such as was done in Colorado by funding the education system.
- III. Support the San Francisco entertainment industry
  - A. Determine whether and how cannabis can be sold and/or consumed in nightclubs, restaurants, and cafes.
  - B. Limit undue impact on neighborhoods and actively promote San Francisco's reputation as a world class destination.

As a result of the raid, I met Dennis Peron, Tony Serra and the world of medical marajuana activism. My case helped motivate the BoS to make medical marajuana enforcment SF's " lowest priority" and in fact introduced me to the "gay marajuana mafia." The health management of my HIV infection has always included medical cannabis and kept me a part of that community.



**Board Qualifications:**

The Cannabis State Legalization Task Force (Task Force) was established to advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and other City departments on matters relating to the potential legalization of cannabis so that the policymakers are fully prepared to address policy questions through legislation and administrative actions, following the adoption of a State law.

The Task Force consists of 22 members (seats 1 through 7 shall be non-voting members):

**DEPARTMENT HEAD MEMBERS**

- > Seat 1: Director of the Department of Public Health, or his/her designee
- > Seat 2: Chief of the Fire Department, or his/her designee
- > Seat 3: Chief of the Police Department, his/her designee
- > Seat 4: Director of the Department of Building Inspection, or his/her designee
- > Seat 5: Director of Planning, or his/her designee
- > Seat 6: Executive Director of the Entertainment Commission, or his/her designee
- > Seat 7: Executive Director of the California Board of Equalization, or his/her designee (if the Executive Director declines and fails to appoint a designee for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a member of the public)
- > Seat 8: Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District, or his/her designee which may include a Member of the Board of Education (if the Superintendent declines and fails to appoint a designee for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a member of the public)
