## Ordinance amending the San Francisco Police Code by adding a new Article 42D to restrict access to products containing thirty-three percent (33\%) or more hydrochloric acid in solution and assessing criminal penalties for violation of this Article. <br> Note: $\quad$ This entire Article is entirely new. <br> Board amendment additions are double underlined. <br> Board amendment deletions are strikethrough normat.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding a new Article 42D, to read as follows:

## ARTICLE 42D

## SALE AND DISPLAY OF PRODUCTS CONTAINING HYDROCHLORIC ACID

Sec. 4200D. 1 DEFINITIONS.
For the purposes of this Article, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
(a) "Hydrochloric Acid" means a chemical substance, also known as muriatic acid or hydrogen chloride, having a chemical formula of HCl and a chemical abstract system number CAS No. 7647-01-0.
(b) "Person" means an individual, trust, firm, joint stock company, corporation.
(c) "Regulated Product" means any consumer product that contains at least thirty-three percent (33\%) hydrochloric acid in solution.

Sec. 4200D. 2 STORAGE AND DISPLAY OF REGULATED PRODUCTS.
(a) It shall be unlawful for any person who owns, conducts, operates or manages a retail commercial establishment where the regulated products are sold to store or display, or caused to be stored or displayed, such regulated products in an area that is accessible to the
public without employee assistance in the regular course of business pending legal sale or other disposition.
(b) Nothing herein shall preclude the storage or display of the regulated products in an area viewable by the public so long as such items are not accessible to the public without employee assistance.

Sec. 4200D. 3 SALE OF REGULATED PRODUCTS.
(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, except a parent or legal guardian, to sell or give or in any way furnish to another person, who is in fact under the age of 18 years, any regulated products without first obtaining bona fide evidence of majority and identity.
(b) For purposes of this Section, "bona fide evidence of majority and identity" is any document evidencing the age and identity of an individual which has been issued by a federal, State or local governmental entity, and includes, but is not limited to, a motor vehicle operator's license or an identification card issued to a member of the armed forces.
(c) Regulated Products may be furnished to schools for school-related activities that are part of the instructional program when used under controlled and supervised situations within the classroom or on the site of a supervised project. The instructors shall not permit students to remove the regulated from the supervised site.
