I am writing to appoint Jane Weil to the open District 6 seat on the Parks, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee (PROSAC). One of my top legislative priorities has been to increase new open space opportunities in my district and improve the existing park spaces we have.

Jane has been an active and engaged member of the District 6 community almost a decade, attending public safety and neighborhood association meetings. She has been a vocal advocate for acquiring 2-3 new parks within District 6, and is acutely aware of the need for increased park staffing and resources to accommodate the growing population boom in the South of Market in particular.

She has focused primarily on highlighting the need for spaces that are welcoming to the diverse mix of families living in the district, and has worked with both SOMACC and the Central Market Community Benefit District to highlight those needs.

Jane is a former member of the District 6 Open Space Acquisition Task Force and continues to be very involved with ongoing efforts to identify, acquire and develop new parks spaces in the district. She will be a vocal advocate for our neighborhoods, and work to represent the community's goals of park creation and activation.

Mid Market is the epicenter of many of the urban problems facing our city: homelessness, drug abuse, mental illness but is also the center of tourism and development, and managing these is a huge challenge.

I am an active Senior Citizen and have grandchildren in the public schools who attend summer camp with the Department of Park & Rec. I am very concerned about the preservation of the open space that we currently have city wide, but even more so about the lack of green space in District 6, which I hope to address on PROSAC.

Business and/or professional experience:

I am retired from a long career in management of design companies. As part of my work for an architectural firm, I attended workshops on Historic Review Regulations from the U.S. Department of the Interior and later served on the Historic Review Commission of Sewickley, Pennsylvania. I have served on numerous Boards of Directors for non-profits, often in a leadership role, including Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, Teach with Africa, Planned Parenthood, SOMACC, and the Central Market CBD.

Civic Activities:

I am passionate about Mid Market and the Central City and serve on Board of the Central Market CBD as Secretary. I am President of the SOMAGrand HOA, on the Sixth Street Consortium Committee, and the Better Market Street CAC.

Previously I served for ten years on the Board of South of Market Childcare, a center serving children from SOMA, predominantly low income, and the Mayors CAC for Community Policing.

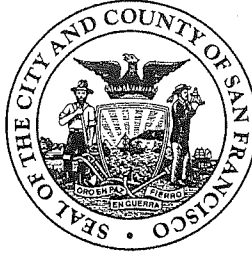

Park Code, Article 13, and Charter, Section 16.107 (Ordinance No. 118-00; and Resolution Nos. 168-01, and 391-13)

Board Qualifications:

The Park, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee consists of a total of twenty-three (23) members. Twenty-two (22) members shall be appointed by the members of the Board of Supervisors and approved by the full Board, with one (1) member appointed by each Supervisor from his/her supervisorial district and one (1) member appointed by each Supervisor from the list maintained by the Recreation and Park Commission of individuals nominated by organizations having as a primary focus park, environmental, recreational, cultural, sports, youth or senior citizen issues (ratified by Resolution No. 391-13). Four (4) of the members chosen from the list maintained by the Commission shall be individuals nominated by an environmental organization. In addition, one (1) member shall be appointed by the Mayor.

If the system of district elections set forth in Charter, Section 13.110, is discontinued, each Supervisor shall appoint one (1) member of the Committee from the list maintained by the Commission and one (1) member without restriction.

The Committee members shall serve for two-year terms at the will of the appointing authority, except that at the first meeting of the Committee, the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department shall, by lot, designate twelve (12) members to serve terms of one (1) year. Thereafter, all members shall be appointed to two-year terms and no member shall serve more than four (4) consecutive terms.

The Advisory Committee shall assist the Planning Commission and Recreation and Park Commission in the implementation of Charter, Section 16.107. They shall assist the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department and the Director of the Planning Department in establishing priorities for renovation, acquisition, development and maintenance of properties in accordance with the Recreation and Open Space Programs to implement the recreation and open space element of the Master Plan.

Reports: Input into the Strategic Plan updated annually, the Capital Plan updated annually, and the Operational Plan updated annually.
