NECESSARY STEPS IN MITIGATING UNSAFE TRAFFIC CONDITIONS IN THE SAN

FRANCISCO MARINA DISTRICT, INCLUDING DECREASING THE SPEED LIMIT ON

MARINA BOULEVARD FROM 35 MILES PER HOUR TO 25 MILES PER HOUR, SITING

ADDITIONAL RED LIGHT CAMERAS ON BOTH MARINA BOULEVARD AND LOMBARD

STREETS, HOLDING HEARINGS ON TRAFFIC CALMING IN THE DISTRICT, AND WORKING

WITH THE CITY ATTORNEY AND THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN CONCERT FOR A

UNIFIED AND COLLABORATIVE EFFORT TO MAKE SAFER STREETS.

WHEREAS, As part of its transit first policy, the City and County of San Francisco is dedicated to making the streets safe for pedestrians and cyclists; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Marina District is popular among joggers, cyclists, pedestrians and other recreationists; and,

WHEREAS, Because of its proximity to the Golden Gate Bridge and Hwy. 101, vehicles tend to continue traveling at a high speed after exiting the highway into the Marina District, including a speed which may exceed the current speed limit of 35 miles per hour on Marina Boulevard and Lombard Street; and,

WHEREAS, Traffic calming and red light running cameras have successfully decreased the City-wide incidence of unlawful and reckless driving which too often results in various types of accidents; and,

WHEREAS, Collisions caused by red light running have decreased by forty percent at camera enforced intersections, whether or not that intersection has a working camera from the partly completed system of 27 cameras rotating among 36 designated locations; and,

WHEREAS, Within the Marina District, the Department of Parking and Traffic has placed a red light camera at the corner of Franklin and Lombard Streets and Caltrans has funded cameras at Richardson Avenue and Francisco Street and at Marina Boulevard and Lyon Street; and,

WHEREAS, The Marina District will face an unknown change in traffic as a result of various projects such as the development of the Letterman Hospital site, an increase in overall occupancy of the Presidio, and the Doyle Drive project; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby urge the Department and the Commission of Parking and Traffic to take all necessary steps in mitigating unsafe traffic conditions in the San Francisco Marina District, including decreasing the speed limit on Marina Boulevard from 35 to 25 miles per hour, siting additional red light cameras on both Marina Boulevard and Lombard Street, holding hearings on traffic calming in the district, and working with the City Attorney and the Police Department in concert for a unified and collaborative effort to make safer streets; and, be it
