WHEREAS, Seniority of the members of the Boa	rd of Supervisors has traditionally
been used to determine priority in determining the assignment of seats in the Board Chamber,	
the assignment of Board offices in City Hall, the assignment of parking spaces at City Hall,	
and in the appointment of Supervisors to compensated commission positions; and	
WHEREAS With the advent of District elections in 2000 it is now necessary to provide	

at City Hall, and S, With the advent of District elections in 2000 it is now necessary to provide

a seniority system that reflects the new conditions arising from District elections; now, therefore, be it

MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby amends the Rules of Order of the Board to add a new Rule 6.21, to read as follows:

- 6.21 BOARD SENIORITY. The assignment to Board members of offices in City Hall, parking spaces at City Hall, seats in the Legislative Chamber, and the appointment of Board members to compensated commission positions, shall be determined by seniority. Seniority shall be determined as provided in this Rule.
- (a) For members of the Board who began uninterrupted service on the Board prior to the inauguration of a new Board of Supervisors on January 8, 2001, and who are inaugurated

on January 8, 2001, seniority shall be initially assumed by those having the longest period of uninterrupted service on the Board of Supervisors. Higher seniority among Supervisors who initially assumed office at the same time shall be determined by awarding higher seniority to the Supervisor who received the higher number of votes in the election that resulted in the beginning of their uninterrupted service.

(b) For members of the Board beginning service on the Board of Supervisors on January 8, 2001, and at any time thereafter, whether elected or appointed, seniority shall be initially assumed by those having the longest period of uninterrupted service on the Board of Supervisors. Higher seniority among Supervisors who initially assumed office at the same time shall be determined by a lottery to be conducted by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at a meeting of the Board of Supervisors held within two weeks of the election or appointment of the new Supervisors.
