 8 authorize a ballot argument in favor of Proposition F, an ordinance
 9 approving the continued imposition of the Stadium Operator
 10 Admission Tax and the Temporary Admission Tax on stadium
 11 admissions, authorizing the establishment of a supplemental stadium
 12 admission tax upon expiration of the temporary admission tax; and,

14 FURTHER MOVED, That the full text of said argument hereby
 15 authorized be as shown in the copy attached to this motion and is
 16 hereby declared to be a part hereof; and, be it

17 FURTHER MOVED, That the Director of Elections be and is hereby
 18 authorized and directed to include said argument in the pamphlet
 19 accompanying the sample ballots to be mailed to the voters of the
 20 City and County of San Francisco for the election to be held on
 21 Tuesday, November 3, 1998.


