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3 **Motion authorizing proponent's ballot argument in favor of Proposition A, a Bond**
4 **Measure regarding a Revenue Bond Election.**

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6 MOVED, That pursuant to Section 540 of the Municipal Elections Code, the Board of
7 Supervisors does hereby authorize a ballot argument in favor of Proposition A, a Resolution
8 calling and providing for a special election to be held in the City and County of San
9 Francisco for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said City and County on
10 November 5, 2002 a proposition for the issuance of revenue bonds and/or other forms of
11 revenue financing by the Public Utilities Commission in a principal amount not to exceed
12 \$1,628,000,000 to finance the acquisition and construction of improvements to the City's
13 water system; making issuance of the bonds subject to the requirement that San Francisco
14 Administrative Code Chapter 37 (Residential Rent Stabilization and Arbitration Ordinance)
15 be amended to provide that (1) 50% of the costs resulting from increased water rates may
16 be passed through from landlords to residential tenants where a unit is in compliance with
17 any applicable laws requiring water conservation devices, and (2) tenants may file hardship
18 applications with the Rent Board for relief from all or part of the cost passthrough and their
19 affected landlords may utilize any available Public Utilities Commission low-income rate
20 discount program or similar program for water bill reduction based on the tenants' hardship
21 status; and for the possible imposition of a surcharge on retail water customers; and
22 consolidating said special election with the General Municipal Election to be held on
23 November 5, 2002; complying with Section 53410 of the California Government Code;
24 finding the proposed project is in conformity with the priority policies of Planning Code
25 Section 101.1(b) and the City's General Plan. , (File 020910); and, be it
