WHEREAS, the purpose of this delegation, which has been welcomed by Mexican President Vincente Fox, is to promote dialogue and implementation of civil rights protection for Mexico's 10 million indigenous people, with the Mexican Congress of Deputies and Senators; and,

WHEREAS, The delegation's purpose is to seek adoption by the Mexican Congress and civil society of the 1996 "San Andreas peace accords" for indigenous rights, which, taken to the constitutional level, will mean the fulfillment of a human and civil rights agreement between the Zapatistas and the Mexican government, a historic, groundbreaking step toward the establishment of peace in Chiapas, and throughout indigenous communities in Mexico; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby commend the peaceful March for Dignity of the Zapatista Delegation to Mexico City on March 11th, 2001.
