

1 [State grants to fund food and agricultural projects.]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) to**  
4 **retroactively accept and expend three grants totaling \$2,877.43, from the California**  
5 **Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA); for the period of July 1, 2007 through**  
6 **June 30, 2008.**

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8 WHEREAS, DPH’s Environmental Health Section was awarded three grants from the  
9 CDFA, including Sudden Oak Death (\$1,377.43), California Organics – Organic Foods Act  
10 (\$1,000), Seed Service and Nursery Stock Inspection Program (\$500); and,

11 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, the CDFA requires the City to  
12 comply with the terms of three separate agreements (the “Agreements”), copies of which are  
13 on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 071470, which is hereby declared  
14 to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

15 WHEREAS, An ASO amendment is not required for these grants, as funds will be used  
16 for a small portion of existing positions within DPH, including .01 FTE Agricultural Inspector  
17 (#3450), .003 FTE Manager I (#0922); and Jr. Administrative Analyst (#1820) for the Sudden  
18 Oak Death grant; .01 FTE Agricultural Biologist (#3450) for the California Organics – Organic  
19 Foods Act grant; and .005 FTE Agricultural Biologist (#3450) for the Seed Service and  
20 Nursery Stock Inspection Program grant; and

21 WHEREAS, CDFA prohibits including indirect costs in the budgets for all but one grant,  
22 the Sudden Oak Death grant (with indirect costs budgeted for \$220.10); now, therefore, be it

23 **RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend three**  
24 **grants in the total amount of \$2,877.43 from the CDFA; and, be it**

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1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate all positions  
2 funded under this agreement as "G" or grant-funded positions which would terminate when  
3 the agreement expires; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of  
5 indirect costs where prohibited in the budget of two of the three Agreements; and, be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
7 Agreements on behalf of the City.
