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4 **Resolution supporting FY2014-2015 Community Development Block Grant, Emergency**
5 **Solutions Grant, and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS Consolidated Plan**
6 **Goals.**

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8 WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as
9 amended, the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act as amended by the Homeless
10 Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing (HEARTH) Act of 2009, the AIDS
11 Housing Opportunity Act and related federal regulations, the City and County of San
12 Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG),
13 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS
14 (HOPWA) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and

15 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately
16 \$17,000,000 in CDBG, \$1,100,000 in ESG and \$8,600,000 in HOPWA Funds from HUD in FY
17 2014-2015; and

18 WHEREAS, On behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, the Mayor’s Office of
19 Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) and the Office of Economic and Workforce
20 Development (OEWD) are preparing to release a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the 2014-
21 2015 CDBG, ESG and HOPWA Programs; and

22 WHEREAS, The RFP is in concert with San Francisco’s 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan;
23 and

24 WHEREAS, The Consolidated Plan was approved by HUD in 2010; and
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1 WHEREAS, The Consolidated Plan details the five goals for the CDBG, ESG and
2 HOPWA Programs: 1) Families and individuals are healthy and economically self-sufficient; 2)
3 Neighborhoods and communities are strong, vibrant and stable; 3) Formerly homeless
4 individuals and families are stable, supported and live in long-term housing; 4) Families and
5 individuals have safe, healthy and affordable housing; and 5) Public housing developments
6 that were severely distressed are thriving mixed-income communities; now, therefore, be it
7 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors continues to support the CDBG, ESG and
8 HOPWA Consolidated Plan goals, and the related 2014-2015 Request for Proposals to
9 achieve these goals.
