[Death Penalty Moratorium]

URGING GOVERNOR GRAY DAVIS TO EFFECT A MORATORIUM ON EXECUTIONS WHILE CALIFORNIA'S DEATH PENALTY PROCEDURES ARE REVIEWED AND EVALUATED.

WHEREAS, California resumed executions in 1992 twenty years after the California Supreme Court declared the death penalty cruel and unusual punishment in violation of the state constitution; and, Nationwide n

WHEREAS λ Ninety-eight people were put to death in 1999, and ten more have been executed already in 2000; and,

WHEREAS, The State of Florida awarded two men \$500,000 each for their erroneous conviction and death sentence thirty years ago when another man confessed to the murders of which they had been convicted; and,

WHEREAS, The State of California has a large and increasing backlog of death penalty appeal cases, due largely to the difficulty in appointing appellate counsel, and this backlog has increased the numbers of prisoners on death row; and,

WHEREAS, The State of California's Legislative Analyst Office highlighted the need for further consideration of the issue in an analysis of the 1997-98 budget to the State Legislature addressing various legislative options which might reduce the backlog of death penalty appeal cases and concluding that "It is not clear, however, that any option will reduce the backlog in the near term"; and,

WHEREAS, The Governor of Illinois, concerned about flaws in the death penalty system in that state, has announced he will grant stays

of execution until the system has been investigated thoroughly by a special commission. This commission will focus on the capital punishment system in general and particularly on the 13 cases in which defendants were found to have been wrongly convicted; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges Governor Gray Davis to effect a moratorium on executions while California's death penalty procedures are reviewed and evaluated; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Clerk of the Board of Supervisors forwards this resolution to Governor Davis, to State Senators Burton and Speier and to Assembly Members Migden and Shelley.
