AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES, A SUBCONTRACT AGREEMENT COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES, TO ENTER INTO AN-AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,844 WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (BERKELEY), THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, TO PROVIDE DATA AND CONSULTATION FOR A STUDY OF THE CULTURAL APPROPRIATENESS OF THE INSTRUMENTS AND APPROACHES BEING USED BY COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES TO MEASURE PERFORMANCE INDICATORS, CLIENT OUTCOMES, AND SATISFACTION, WHICH DOES NOT INCLUDE PATENT INFRINGEMENT INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; WAIVING INDIRECT COSTS.

WHEREAS, The University of California (Berkeley) has received funds from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), for a project entitled "Center on Financing of Care for the Severely Mentally Ill"; and

WHEREAS, The University of California (Berkeley) as the primary contractor, has requested that the Department of Public Health, Community Health Services, Community Mental Health Services, enter into a subcontract to participate in this project; and

WHEREAS, The University of California (Berkeley) has agreed to reimburse the Department of Public Health, in the amount of \$7,844 under the terms of this subcontract; and

WHEREAS, The subcontract specifies that the Department of Public Health is to provide data and consultation deemed necessary to meet the reporting requirements of the DHHS Granting Agency during the term of the subcontract; and

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds, the University of California (Berkeley) requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 990532; and

WHEREAS, The University of California (Berkeley) has indicated that it will not agree to any modification to the form of the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The University of California (Berkeley) does not allow for indirect costs for this subcontract; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to enter into an a subcontract agreement agreement in the amount of \$7,844 with the University of California (Berkeley), the primary contractor, for provision of data and consultation; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby waive indirect costs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Sections 6.21 and 21.19 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification by the University of California (Berkeley) of the City for the infringement of patent rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 6.57(c) of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 6.57(a) of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of Public Health to enter into similar agreements with the University of California (Berkeley) if the contract recurs or renewed.
