WHEREAS, San Francisco's Housing Element was adopted in 2023 and requires the City to implement a plan to meet the goal of constructing 82,069 units by 2030 with a focus on increasing capacity in neighborhoods that historically built less housing; and

WHEREAS, The City is facing a significant shortage of affordable housing and has not been able to meet housing goals for low and moderate-income households requiring the need to plan for additional 20,300 very low-income units, 11,640 low-income units, and 8,400 moderate-income units; and

WHEREAS. This affordability crisis disproportionately affects low and middle-income residents, many of whom play essential roles in San Francisco's community, and includes educators, healthcare workers, first responders, construction workers, and service workers; and

WHEREAS, Building affordable housing is a crucial aspect of any strategy to alleviate San Francisco's affordability crisis, but has been challenging due to limited funding sources such as including investments from regional, State and Federal agency resources (including municipal bonds), tax credits, and developer impact fees, which are subject to the volatility of the market; and

1	WHEREAS, "Well Resourced Neighborhoods" have not seen a proportional share of
2	affordable housing development in decades, leading to geographic wealth inequalities and
3	severely limited housing options; and
4	WHEREAS, The City will be implementing Housing Element through a proposed
5	rezoning effort that will primarily focus on increasing housing capacity in Well-Resourced
6	Neighborhoods, and this effort includes adopting inclusionary housing policies to increase
7	housing opportunities to create a more equitable distribution of housing throughout the city;
8	and
9	WHEREAS, The Housing Element included a goal to build between 25% and 50% of
10	the City's newly permanently affordable housing in Well Resourced Neighborhoods over the
11	next two RHNA cycles, but does not include funding strategies to build housing for low and
12	moderate incomes; and
13	WHEREAS, Enhanced Infrastructure Financing Districts ("EIFDs") could provide a
14	steady source of funding by allowing future property tax revenue growth within set boundaries
15	to be dedicated to affordable housing developments and other infrastructure costs; and
16	WHEREAS, The Housing Element includes an Implementation Program (Action 1.1.4)
17	that suggests exploring the development of public financing tools including EIFDs; and
18	WHEREAS, The City already established EIFDs for large development sites, including
19	Potrero Power Station and more recently for 3333 & 3700 California and Stonestown; and
20	WHEREAS, Exploring the possibility of an EIFD focused on Well-Resourced
21	Neighborhoods is a crucial step towards providing affordable housing and robust
22	infrastructure in Well Resourced Neighborhoods as a component of the City's Housing
23	Element; and

1	WHEREAS, The establishment of an EIFD would potentially allow San Francisco to
2	expedite the development of affordable housing on the Westside, allowing more low and
3	middle-income households to stay in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it
4	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors expresses interest in establishing an
5	EIFD within the boundaries of the Well-Resourced Neighborhoods of San Francisco, with the
6	stated goal of supporting and bolstering affordable housing development and associated
7	infrastructure costs in Well-Resourced Neighborhoods, thereby making housing more
8	affordable and equitable; and, be it
9	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Office of the
10	Controller, Office of Economic & Workforce Development, and the Mayor's Office of Housing
11	and Community Development to explore the formation of the aforementioned EIFD and to
12	provide recommendations on scenario options, including revenue calculations, feasibility,
13	scope, and other implementation considerations by November 1, 2025, and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Office of the
15	Controller, Office of Economic & Workforce Development, and the Mayor's Office of Housing
16	and Community Development to also include in their recommendations other innovative
17	financing tools to support the development of affordable housing in Well-Resourced
18	Neighborhoods and more stable development particularly during economic downturns; and be
19	it
20	FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution is not a "Resolution of Intention" for
21	purposes of California Government Code, Section 53398.59; and
22	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board
23	to transmit copies of this Resolution to the Office of the Controller, the Office of Economic
24	Workforce Development, and the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development.
