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3 Resolution authorizing the Office of the Mayor, Office of the City Attorney, and Office of 4 the City Administrator, and the head of each division, office, and department under the 5 supervision of the City Administrator, to solicit donations from various private, 6 nonprofit, philanthropic, and other entities to support 1) the urgent provision of legal 7 services related to the creation and enforcement of immigration laws, regulations, and 8 policies, including litigation and regulatory reform efforts at the local, state, and federal 9 level and non-legal services and support for the City's immigrant communities; 2) 10 goods and services, including legal services, related to defending and supporting LGBTQ+ rights; 3) goods and services, including legal services, related to defending 11 12 and supporting reproductive rights; 4) goods and services, including legal services, 13 related to defending existing environmental protection laws and promoting environmental protection efforts; and 5) goods and services, including legal services, 14 15 related to racial equity initiatives, all notwithstanding the Behested Payment Ordinance. 16 17 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco ("the City") has a longstanding 18 commitment to advocate for the fair and lawful treatment of all City residents, including hard 19

working people and families, notwithstanding their immigration status; and 20

WHEREAS, The City has long led the country in legal advocacy for the rights of 21 LGBTQ+ individuals and support for the community in a variety of ways, creating a place 22 where LGBTQ+ people feel safe and able to live their lives without fear of violence and 23 discrimination, and making the City home to a large and vibrant LGBTQ+ community; these 24 25

efforts include securing equal benefits and marriage equality, and providing health and
 housing services targeted to support the community; and

WHEREAS, The City's laws and policies have made San Francisco a place where
people have the freedom to make their own reproductive healthcare decisions without
intrusion from the government; the City has advocated for these legal rights through litigation
as well as provided financial and other support to promote reproductive freedom; and

WHEREAS; The City has numerous policies and initiatives aimed at reducing the City's
impact on the environment, including policies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, conserve
water, and reduce solid waste; and the City has pursued legal action to enforce the City's
environmental laws and goals; and

11 WHEREAS; The City has a legal framework and numerous programs and policies to 12 remedy the effects of past racial discrimination and to eliminate such discrimination and 13 ensure racial equity for all City residents, including the efforts of the City's Office of Racial 14 Equity, and other initiatives and policies targeted to help underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, Consistent with the authority and duty of that office, the City Attorney monitors federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and policies impacting the health, safety, and day-to-day lives of San Franciscans including those related to immigration, LGBTQ+ rights, reproductive rights, environmental protection, and racial equity and, as necessary,

19 engages in advocacy and litigation regarding these issues; and

20 WHEREAS, San Francisco's private, nonprofit, and philanthropic community, including 21 members of the legal community, have a proud history of supporting the City in protecting the 22 rights of residents of the City, the environment, and the fair and equal treatment of all 23 individuals without regard to race; and

WHEREAS, While the City Attorney continues these efforts, we know that more
resources will be urgently needed in the near future to ensure that City residents are treated

fairly, with dignity, and consistently with local, state, and federal law, and that the City's efforts
to protect the environment and promote fair and equal treatment for all people are not

3 undermined; and

WHEREAS, In the past, the City Attorney has established successful and innovative
public-private partnerships to pursue these aims; and

6 WHEREAS, The City Attorney, Office of the Mayor, and Office of the City Administrator
7 from time to time partner and engage with philanthropic organizations, nonprofits, and private
8 entities including law firms and legal service organizations; and

9 WHEREAS, The Office of the City Attorney, Office of the Mayor, Office of the City
10 Administrator, and the head of each division, office, and department under the City
11 Administrator's supervision may seek to fundraise or engage in philanthropic partnerships with
12 law firms and other entities yet to be identified that may be considered interested parties to
13 one or more of these departments for the purposes identified herein; and

14 WHEREAS, The Office of the Mayor, Office of the City Attorney, Office of the City 15 Administrator, and the head of each division, office, and department under the City 16 Administrator's supervision seek a waiver of the City's Behested Payment Ordinance 17 (Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section 3.600 et seq.) to the extent it restricts 18 the Mayor, City Attorney, City Administrator and employees under the supervision of the 19 Offices of the Mayor, City Attorney, and City Administrator, and the head of each division, 20 office, and department under the City Administrator's supervision from soliciting financial 21 support or in-kind goods or services, from persons or entities that would be considered 22 interested parties, to support (1) the provision of legal services to ensure the fair and lawful 23 treatment of City residents notwithstanding their immigration status and non-legal services 24 and support for the City's immigrant communities, (2) goods and services, including legal 25 services, related to defending and supporting LGBTQ+ rights, (3) goods and services,

including legal services, related to defending and supporting reproductive rights, (4) goods
and services, including legal services, related to defending existing environmental protection
laws and promoting environmental protection efforts, and (5) goods and services, including
legal services, related to racial equity initiatives; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That under Section 3.620(f) of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct 5 Code, the Board of Supervisors hereby waives application of the Behested Payment 6 Ordinance as to the Mayor, City Attorney, City Administrator, officers and employees under 7 the supervision of the Offices of the Mayor, City Attorney, and City Administrator, and the 8 heads of each division, office, and department under the City Administrator's supervision so 9 that they may solicit donations from private, nonprofit, and other organizations and 10 philanthropists to support (1) the provision of legal services to ensure the fair and lawful 11 treatment of City residents notwithstanding their immigration status and non-legal services 12 and support for the City's immigrant communities, (2) goods and services, including legal 13 services, related to defending and supporting LGBTQ+ rights, (3) goods and services, 14 including legal services, related to defending and supporting reproductive rights, (4) goods 15 and services, including legal services, related to defending existing environmental protection 16 laws and promoting environmental protection efforts, and (5) goods and services, including 17 legal services, related to racial equity initiatives; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That granting this waiver serves the public interest by supporting the Office of the Mayor, Office of the City Attorney, and Office of the City Administrator, and division, office and department heads under the City Administrator in the provision of legal services and other support to ensure fair and lawful treatment of all City residents notwithstanding their immigration status, to support and defend LGBTQ+ rights, to support and defend reproductive freedom, to bolster and defend environmental protection efforts, and to protect initiatives that ensure all people are treated fairly regardless of race, at

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1	a time when the provision of such services and support may be more urgently required than					
2	ever before; and, be it					
3	FURTHER RESOLVED, That granting this waiver does not create an appearance of					
4	impropriety.
