3	Resolution urging San Francisco employers to abide by the Universal Declaration of
4	Human Rights and urging the 108 th United States Congress to pass the Employee Free
5	Choice Act.

7	WHEREAS, Every year since 1948 on December 10, tens of thousands of workers and
8	allies mobilize to restore workers' freedom to join a union; and
9	WHEREAS, In 1948 the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was ratified by Eleano
10	Roosevelt and four fifths of the member countries of the United Nations; and
11	WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 1 states:
12 13	"Everyone has the right to work, to free choice of employment, to just and favorable conditions
14	of work and to protection against unemployment"; and
15	WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 2 states:
16	"Everyone without any discrimination, has the right to equal pay for equal work"; and
17	WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 3 states:
18	"Everyone who works has the right to just and favorable remuneration ensuring for him/hersel
19	and his/her family an existence worthy of human dignity, and supplemented, if necessary, by
2021	other means of social protection"; and
22	WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 4 states:
23	"Everyone has the right to form and to join trade unions for the protection of his/her interests";

1	WHEREAS, Everyday employers in the United States violate workers rights as
2	described under the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and
3	WHEREAS, United States laws have given workers the right to organize since 1935,
4	however these federal laws have eroded over the years and are poorly enforced; and
5	WHEREAS, Even though United States laws guarantee workers' rights to choose for
6 7	themselves whether or not to form a union, employers across the nation routinely violate that
8	right; and
9	WHEREAS, Firing or discriminating against workers who try to form unions is illegal bu
10	commonplace in the United States; and
11	WHEREAS, Employers can legally force workers to attend closed-door meetings about
12	the union on work time; and
13	WHEREAS, Workers are usually not free to attend their own meetings about forming a
14	union on work time and must meet outside of work to discuss unionization; and
15 16	WHEREAS, Millions of workers in the United States, such as temporary or contractual
17	workers, are not covered by laws that are supposed to protect the right to organize or bargain
18	collectively; and
19	WHEREAS, Congressman George Miller (D-CA) and Senator Edward Kennedy (D-MA
20	have introduced the Employee Free Choice Act-legislation that will strengthen workers' rights
21	in the United States; now, therefore, be it
22	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
23	hereby urges San Francisco employers to respect workers' rights under the Universal
24	notes, angue sant tanoisse employers to respect workers fights ander the emittered

3	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San

6	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
7 8	Francisco will continue to work with the labor movement to ensure that all workers understand
9	their rights to organize.
