

1 [WSIP Agreement No. CS-913, Bay Tunnel Project Construction Management Services.]

3 **Resolution approving the selection of Jacobs Engineering; awards Water System**  
4 **Improvement Program-funded Agreement No. CS-913, Bay Tunnel Project Construction**  
5 **Management Services.**

7 WHEREAS, It is necessary to procure the services of a qualified Construction  
8 Management firm to provide specialized construction management services to supplement  
9 SFPUC staff through the Agreement No. CS-913, Bay Tunnel Construction Management  
10 Services, and

11 WHEREAS, The estimated cost of services is up to \$18,000,000 assuming that the  
12 Commission approves the proposed BDPL Reliability Upgrade – Tunnel Project (Project)  
13 following review and consideration of the certified Final Environmental Impact Report; and

14 WHEREAS, The proposal was advertised on February 12, 2008; and

15  
16 WHEREAS, Services are anticipated to begin in August 2008 and, if the Commission  
17 approves the BDPL Reliability Upgrade – Tunnel Project, end in January 2014 and the  
18 duration of this agreement is up to 65 months; and

19 WHEREAS, SFPUC staff and HRC review of the proposals resulted in the  
20 establishment of Jacobs Engineering as the best qualified consulting firm; and

21 WHEREAS, An HRC sub-consulting goal of 5% LBE participation has been established  
22 and approved for this agreement by the HRC Contract Compliance Officer assigned to the  
23 SFPUC. Jacobs Engineering is committed to meet the LBE goal of 17.7% submitted in its  
24 proposal which exceeds the HRC goal established; and

1           WHEREAS, Failure to reach successful agreement on contract terms and conditions  
2 within 30 days of the date of the Commission award may result in award of the contract to the  
3 next highest ranked proposer, or re-advertising and re-selecting consultants at the discretion  
4 of the City; and

5           WHEREAS, The firms being awarded a contract by the SFPUC must be in compliance  
6 with the Equal Benefits Provisions of Chapter 12B of the City’s Administrative Code either at  
7 the time of the award, or within 2 weeks of the date of the Commission award; failure of the  
8 bidder to obtain compliance certification from HRC may, in the General Manager’s sole  
9 discretion, result in award of the agreement to the next highest ranked proposer, or re-  
10 advertising and re-selecting consultants at the discretion of the City; and

11           WHEREAS, Funds for this agreement will be available at the time of award of the  
12 agreement from Project CUW36801, Bay Tunnel Project; and

13           WHEREAS, SFPUC resolution No. 08-0108 approved the selection of Jacobs  
14 Engineering; awards Water Enterprise Water System Improvement Program-funded  
15 Agreement No. CS-913, Bay Tunnel Project Construction Management Services, to provide  
16 construction management services; and authorized the General Manager of the San  
17 Francisco Public Utilities Commission to negotiate a professional services agreement with  
18 Jacobs Engineering for an amount not to exceed \$18,000,000, and with a duration of up to 65  
19 months, or, in the event negotiations are not successful or City requirements are not satisfied,  
20 to negotiate a professional services agreement with the next highest ranked proposer,  
21 provided that expenditures shall be limited to pre-construction activities until such time as the  
22 Commission reviews and considers the Final Environmental Impact Report and determines

1 whether or not to approve the proposed Project; and authorized the General Manager to  
2 execute the agreement, subject to Board of Supervisors' approval pursuant to Charter Section  
3 9.118; now, therefore, be it

4           RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors hereby approves the selection of Jacobs  
5 Engineering; awards Water Enterprise Water System Improvement Program-funded  
6 Agreement No. CS-913, Bay Tunnel Project Construction Management Services, to provide  
7 construction management services; and authorizes the General Manager of the San  
8 Francisco Public Utilities Commission to negotiate a professional services agreement with  
9 Jacobs Engineering for an amount not to exceed \$18,000,000, and with a duration of up to 65  
10 months, or, in the event negotiations are not successful or City requirements are not satisfied,  
11 to negotiate a professional services agreement with the next highest ranked proposer,  
12 provided that expenditures shall be limited to pre-construction activities until such time as the  
13 Commission reviews and considers the Final Environmental Impact Report and determines  
14 whether or not to approve the proposed Project; and authorizes the General Manager to  
15 execute the agreement.
