9 the City and County of San Francisco; and,

10 WHEREAS, Max was a loyal and faithful companion of Paul Imperiale for a year;

12 WHEREAS, Max was more than a service dog, he also protected and was a loving
13 friend to his owner; and,

14 WHEREAS, Max also served as a stress reliever for the staff at administrative
15 services; and,

16 WHEREAS, Max will be missed by all who had the pleasure of his company, but
17 particularly his owner, Paul Imperiale, with whom he had a unique and special
18 relationship; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors honors Max for his
20 loyalty and dedication as a service dog.


