

1 [Obtain, Accept and Expend federal Interoperable Emergency Communications Program
2 Grant and Amend Annual Salary Ordinance, FY 2008-2009.]

3 **Ordinance authorizing the Department of Emergency Management (DEM), as primary**
4 **grantee and fiscal agent for the Capitol-Bay Planning Area, to obtain, accept and**
5 **expend an Interoperable Emergency Communications Program Grant (IECGP) award in**
6 **the amount of \$1,374,422 from the United States Department of Homeland Security**
7 **(DHS), through the California Office of Homeland Security (OHS), for the period**
8 **October 6, 2008 to May 31, 2010, and amending Ordinance No. 141-08 (Annual Salary**
9 **Ordinance, FY 2008-2009) to reflect the addition of one grant-funded position (0.50 FTE**
10 **- 0931 Manager III) in the Department of Emergency Management.**

16 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

17 Section 1. Findings.

18 (a) The Interoperable Emergency Communications Grant Program (IECGP) is
19 designed to address systemic shortfalls in emergency communication systems and to improve
20 local, tribal, regional, statewide, and national interoperable emergency communications,
21 including communications in collective response to natural disasters, acts of terrorism, and
22 other man-made disasters. IECGP funding enables States, Territories, local units of
23 government, and tribal communities to implement their Statewide Communication
24 Interoperability Plans (SCIP) and align to the National Emergency Communications Plan
25 (NECP) to further enhance interoperability. The Federal Emergency Management Agency

1 (FEMA) administers the IECGP. In California, IECGP grant funds are allocated through the
2 Governor's Office of Homeland Security (OHS).

3 (b) In connection with the California SCIP, the City and County of San Francisco and
4 its regional partners the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San
5 Benito, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma (collectively, the Bay
6 Region partners) are working collaboratively with the County of Sacramento and its regional
7 partners the Counties of Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Placer, San Joaquin,
8 Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Yolo (collectively, the Capitol Region partners). Together, the
9 Capitol Region partners and Bay Region partners constitute the Capitol-Bay Planning Area.

10 (c) FEMA has allocated IECGP grant funds in the amount of \$1,374,422 to the Capitol-
11 Bay Planning Area. The Capitol-Bay Planning Area partners must submit an application to
12 obtain those funds. The Capitol-Bay Planning Area intends to use the grant funds for an
13 interoperable communication project that encompasses planning and training among the
14 partner jurisdictions in both the Capitol and Bay Area regions and benefits all recipient
15 jurisdictions.

16 (d) The grant period is from October 6, 2008 to May 31, 2010.

17 (e) Under the grant award and with the agreement of all partner jurisdictions, San
18 Francisco is designated as the primary grantee and fiscal agent for receipt and expenditure of
19 the grant funds.

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21 Section 2. Authorization to Obtain Grant Funds.

22 The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Executive Director of the Department
23 of Emergency Management (DEM), or designee, to complete and submit any

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1 application or other materials or agreements necessary to obtain the IECGP funding
2 allocated to the Capitol-Bay Planning Area..

3 Section 3. Authorization to Accept and Expend Grant Funds.

4 (a) The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Department of Emergency
5 Management (DEM) to accept and expend, as primary grantee and fiscal agent for the
6 Capitol-Bay Planning Area, \$1,374,422 in IECGP grant funds from the DHS, through the
7 OHS, for the period October 6, 2008 to May 31, 2010.

8 (b) The grant does not include any provisions for indirect costs, and indirect costs are
9 hereby waived.

10 (c) The DEM Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, is authorized to
11 enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa,
12 Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Santa Clara, Solano, and
13 Sonoma, and Sacramento, on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco, to govern
14 acceptance, allocation, distribution and any other procedures or actions related to the IECGP
15 grant. The DEM Executive Director, or the Executive Director's designee, is further
16 authorized to furnish whatever additional information or assurances FEMA or OHS may
17 request in connection with the IECGP grant, to execute any and all agreements or other
18 documents, and to take any other steps necessary to accept, distribute and expend the grant
19 funds.

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21 Section 4. Grant Funded Position; Amendment to FY 2008-2009 Annual Salary
22 Ordinance. The hereinafter designated section and item of Ordinance No. 141-08 (Annual
23 Salary Ordinance, FY 2008-2009) is hereby amended so that it reads as follows:
