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Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health to accept and expend retroactively a grant in the amount of \$108,600 from the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium, to assist with a project entitled "Homeless Health and Wellness Training" for the period of March 27, 2009, through March 26, 2011.

[Accept and Expend Grant - Homeless Health and Wellness Training - \$108,600.]

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium is the recipient of a grant award from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to fund a two-year project entitled "Homeless Health and Wellness Training;" and,

WHEREAS, Through this grant, San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium has agreed to fund DPH in the amount of \$108,600 for the period of March 27, 2009 through March 26, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, This award is issued under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009; and,

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. $\frac{100207}{}$; which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

WHEREAS, DPH will subcontract with the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium, in the amount of \$18,000 for the period of March 27, 2009 through March 26, 2011 to provide for the AmeriCorps Intern Program; and,

WHEREAS, An ASO amendment is not required as the grant partially reimburses DPH for one existing position, Public Health Nurse (Job Class #2830) at 0.30 FTE, for the period March 27, 2009 through, March 26, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because the DPH did not receive a finalized budget until December 9, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, The budget does not include a provision for indirect costs because indirect costs are not allowed by the funding agency; now therefore, be it

Contract Term: <u>3/27/2009-3/26/2011</u>

This Addendum Number III (the "Addendum") is entered into effective March 27, 2009 by and between the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation (the "Consortium"), and San Francisco Department of Public Health, a California city and county governmental agency (the "Clinic"). This Addendum is entered into pursuant to that certain Master Health Care Services Agreement (the "Master Agreement") effective July 1, 2008 by and between the Consortium and the Clinic, and which is incorporated by reference herein.

ARTICLE I CLINIC DUTIES

- 1.01 <u>Provide Health Care Services</u>. The Clinic shall provide Health Care for the Homeless services in accordance with the terms of the currently executed Master Agreement and Health Care for the Homeless (HCH) Addendum between the parties, as supplemented by this Addendum and applicable terms of the Notice of Grant Award from DHHS/HRSA to the Consortium for ARRA grant award number 1H8BCS12114, which are incorporated herein by reference.
- 1.02 <u>Support for Increased Demand for Services (IDS)</u>. This Addendum is issued to support increased HCH services at currently approved HCH sites, and for spikes in demand to serve San Francisco's uninsured homeless population.
- 1.03 Work Plan Subject to Revision. It may be necessary for DHHS/HRSA to conduct further review and assessment of the information submitted in the Consortium's ARRA grant application. The result of this review may require that additional information or a revised work plan be submitted. Additional program expectations may require revision of this Addendum, as needed to comply with the terms of a revised Notice of Grant Award from DHHS/HRSA.
- 1.04 <u>Annual Deliverables</u>. Clinic shall provide services annually at the following levels. If Clinic is not on target to provide 90% of its total contracted encounters and/or serve 90% of its contracted program users and on target to provide 80% of its contracted encounters for each type of service, the Clinic must provide to the Consortium a written explanation for below-target performances and a work plan to bring, the program into compliance in the subsequent

quarter. If, during the subsequent quarter, Clinic does not remedy its performance and meet target levels, the Consortium has the right to proportionally withhold payment on Clinic invoice(s) and/or reduce the contract award amount through a contract modification.

600 unduplicated homeless clients

Services:

800 nursing encounters

Jobs Created/Retained: .3 FTE nurse

- 1.05 Reports. The Clinic shall provide data and program reports concerning the services the Clinic has agreed to deliver under this Addendum, in accordance with the following schedule.
- 1.05.1 <u>Invoicing and Service Data</u>. A Consortium Invoice and HCH data that are clearly designated as pertaining to IDS activities must be submitted to the Consortium for each month by the seventh (7th) day of the following month, and in accordance with the terms of Master Agreement Article III.
- 1.05.2 Quarterly Progress Report. Not later than seven (7) days after the end of each calendar quarter, starting with the quarter ending June 30, 2009, the Clinic must submit a quarterly report to the Consortium containing the following information:
 - a. The total amount of ARRA funds under this award;
 - b. The amount of ARRA funds received under this award that were obligated and expended during the quarter;
 - c. The amount of unobligated award balance;
 - d. A detailed list of all projects and activities for which ARRA funds under this award were obligated and expended, including:
 - The name of the project or activity;
 - · A description of the project or activity;
 - · An evaluation of the completion status of the project or activity; and
 - An estimate of the number of jobs created and the number of jobs retained by the project or activity.
- 1.05.3 <u>Reporting Requirements Subject to Revision</u>. The definition of terms and data elements, as well as any specific instructions for reporting, including required formats, will be provided in subsequent guidance issued by DHHS/HRSA. Program-specific reporting requirements may require revision of this Addendum, as needed to comply with the terms of a revised Notice of Grant Award from DHHS/HRSA.
- 1.05.4 Other Federal Reports. Clinic shall cooperate with and, as reasonably requested, assist Consortium in the development and preparation of those portions of the HRSA Uniform Data System (UDS) report and Financial Status Report (FSR), as well as other required reports pertaining to IDS activities under this Agreement. Such reports shall

be prepared according to the timeframes reasonably established by the Consortium's President and Chief Executive Officer, and shall be reviewed and revised in accordance with the directives of the Consortium.

1.05.5 Independent Financial Audit. Clinic agrees to separately identify the expenditures for each grant award funded under ARRA on the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA) and the Data Collection Form (SF-SAC) required by Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, "Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations." This identification on the SEFA and SF-SAC shall include the Federal award number, the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number, and amount, such that separate accountability and disclosure is provided for ARRA funds by Federal award number consistent with the recipient reports required by ARRA Section 1512(c). (2 CFR 215.26, 45 CFR 74.26, and 45 CFR 92.26).

ARTICLE II COMPENSATION

- 2.01 <u>Compensation.</u> Subject to the availability of grant funds, the Consortium shall pay Clinic an amount not to exceed \$54,300.00 annually and \$108,600.00 total over the two-year term of this Addendum, to provide services pursuant to this Agreement for the term hereof.
- 2.02 <u>Payment of Compensation.</u> The Consortium shall make payments to the Clinic in accordance with the terms set forth in the Master Agreement.
- 2.03 <u>Budget.</u> The budget for the provision of services pursuant to this Addendum is set forth in Attachment 1.
- 2.03.1 <u>Budget Revision</u>. Any budget revision is subject to the terms of Master Agreement Section 3.01(e). Clinic must obtain prior approval from Consortium for any significant re-budgeting of project costs, i.e., when cumulative transfers among direct cost budget categories for the current budget period exceed 25 percent of the total approved budget (inclusive of direct and indirect costs and Federal funds and required matching or cost-sharing) for that budget period, or if the re-budgeting reflects a "change in scope" of the approved project or a proposed purchase of a unit of equipment exceeding \$25,000.
- 2.03.2 <u>Purchase of American-made Equipment and Products</u>. To the greatest extent practicable, all equipment and products purchased with funds made available under this award should be American-made.
- 2.03.3 <u>Prevailing Wages</u>. Subject to further clarification issued by the Office of Management and Budget, and notwithstanding any other provision of law and in a manner consistent with other provisions of ARRA, all laborers and mechanics employed by Clinic and any contractors or subcontractors on projects funded directly by or assisted in whole or in

part by and through the Federal Government pursuant to this award shall be paid wages at rates not less than those prevailing on projects of a character similar in the locality as determined by the Secretary of Labor in accordance with subchapter IV of chapter 31 of title 40, United States Code. With respect to the labor standards specified in this section, the Secretary of Labor shall have the authority and functions set forth in Reorganization Plan Numbered 14 of 1950 (64 Stat. 1267; 5 U.S.C. App.) and section 3145 of title 40, United States Code. (ARRA Sec. 1606).

- 2.03.4 Expeditious and Optimal Usage of Funds. In using funds for this award for infrastructure investment, Clinic shall give preference to activities that can be started and completed expeditiously, including a goal of using at least 50 percent of the funds for activities that can be initiated not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of ARRA. Recipients shall also use grant funds in a manner that maximizes job creation and economic benefit.
- 2.04 One-time funding. These are one-time funds and there is no expectation for continued support of IDS activities after the end of the two (2)-year project period.
- 2.05 Restrictions on the Use of Grant Funds. No IDS funds may be used to support any costs related to:
 - Construction (including minor alterations and renovation);
 - Any changes to the current scope of project;
 - Facility or land purchases;
 - Equipment items costing \$5,000 or more;
 - Maintenance or repair of a public building or public work, unless all of the iron, steel, and manufactured goods used in the project are produced in the United States;
 - Any casino or other gambling establishment, aquarium, zoo, golf course, or swimming pool.

ARTICLE III TERM, MODIFICATION, SUSPENSION AND TERMINATION

- 3.01 <u>Term.</u> The term of this Addendum shall be twenty-four (24) months beginning on March 27, 2009 and ending on March 26, 2011.
- 3.02 <u>Contract Modification</u>. Contract Modifications are subject to the terms of the Master Agreement.

3.03 <u>Termination or Suspension.</u> Notwithstanding the preceding sections, this Addendum may be terminated or suspended in accordance with the terms set forth in the Master Agreement.

ARTICLE IV GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 4.01 <u>Effectiveness of Current Master Agreement and Addendum.</u> The rights and obligations of the Consortium and the Clinic shall be otherwise governed by the terms of the current Master Agreement and Health Care for the Homeless Addendum. In the event that the terms of the agreements are inconsistent, the terms of this Addendum shall govern.
- 4.02 Governing Law. All grant policy terms and conditions contained in applicable Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Grant Policy Statements apply, unless they conflict or are superseded by the terms and conditions implementing the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) requirements. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with applicable state and federal laws, regulations and policies, including but not limited to:
 - 4:02.1 PHS Grants Administration Manual Chapters in effect as of the beginning date of the agreement period;
- 4:02.2 PHS Grants Policy Statement in effect as of the beginning date of the agreement period. Parts I through III of the HHS GPS are currently available at ftp://ftp.hrsa.gov/grants/hhsgrantspolicystatement.pdf and it is anticipated that Part IV, HRSA program-specific guidance will be available at the website in the near future. Once available, Part IV, HRSA program-specific guidance will take precedence over Parts I and II in situations where there are conflicting or otherwise inconsistent policies;

4:02.3 45 C.F.R. Part 74 (DHHS Grants Administration regulation); and 4:02.4 Relevant OMB Circulars.

Each party is responsible for assuring its knowledge of these laws, regulations and policies. In the event that there are conflicting or otherwise inconsistent policies applicable to this Agreement, or in the event that the Consortium's comprehensive plan and financial budget are inconsistent with the laws, regulations and policies listed above, the laws, regulations and policies shall prevail in the order of precedence listed in Section 4.02 above.

4.03 <u>Funding Acknowledgment.</u> When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, Clinic shall clearly state the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money, the dollar amount of Federal funds for the project or program, and percentage and a dollar amount of the total costs of the project or program that will be financed by nongovernmental sources.

Clinic acknowledges that it is subject to the strictures of the Medicare and Medicaid (Medi-Cal) anti-kickback statute (42 U.S.C. 1320a 7b(b)) and is cognizant of the risk of criminal and administrative liability under this statute, specifically under 42 U.S.C. 1320 7b(b) "Illegal remunerations" which states, in part, that "whoever knowingly and willingly: (a) solicits or receives (or offers or pays) any remuneration (including kickback, bribe, or rebate) directly or indirectly, overtly or covertly, in cash or in kind, in return for referring (or to induce such person to refer) an individual to a person for the furnishing or arranging for the furnishing of any item or service, OR (b) in return for purchasing, leasing, ordering, or recommending purchasing, leasing, or ordering, or to purchase, lease, or order, any good, facility, services, or item . . . for which payment may be made in whole or in part under subchapter XIII of this chapter or a State health care program, shall be guilty of a felony and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$25,000 or imprisoned for not more than five years, or both."
- 4.05 False Claims Act.
