

1 [Planning Code - Landmark Designation - Henry Street Rowhouses]

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3 **Ordinance amending the Planning Code to designate the Henry Street Rowhouses**
 4 **located at 191-197 Henry Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 3540, Lot No. 092, on the**
 5 **south side of Henry Street between Castro Street and Noe Street, as a landmark**
 6 **consistent with the standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code; affirming the**
 7 **Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act;**
 8 **and making public necessity, convenience, and welfare findings under Planning Code,**
 9 **Section 302, and findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority**
 10 **policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.**

18 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

19 Section 1. Findings.

20 (a) Environmental and Land Use Findings.

21 (1) The Planning Department has determined that the Planning Code
 22 amendment proposed in this ordinance is subject to a Categorical Exemption from the
 23 California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et
 24 seq., hereinafter "CEQA") pursuant to Section 15308 of California Code of Regulations, Title
 25 14, Sections 15000 et seq., the Guidelines for implementation of the statute, for actions by
 regulatory agencies for protection of the environment (in this case, landmark designation).

1 Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.
2 _____ and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board of Supervisors affirms
3 this determination.

4 (2) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, the Board of Supervisors finds that
5 the proposed landmark designation of the Henry Street Rowhouses will serve the public
6 necessity, convenience, and welfare for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation
7 Commission Resolution No. _____, recommending approval of the proposed
8 designation, which is incorporated herein by reference.

9 (3) The Board of Supervisors finds that the proposed landmark designation of
10 the Henry Street Rowhouses is consistent with the General Plan and with Planning Code
11 Section 101.1(b) for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation Commission Resolution No.
12 _____, which is incorporated herein by reference.

13 (b) General Findings.

14 (1) On March 3, 2026, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 104-
15 26, initiating landmark designation of the Henry Street Rowhouses as a San Francisco
16 Landmark pursuant to Section 1004.1 of the Planning Code. On October 24, 2025, the Mayor
17 approved the resolution. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in
18 File No. 260057.

19 (2) Pursuant to Charter Section 4.135, the Historic Preservation Commission
20 has authority “to recommend approval, disapproval, or modification of landmark designations
21 and historic district designations under the Planning Code to the Board of Supervisors.”

22 (3) The Landmark Designation Fact Sheet dated May 20, 2026 was prepared
23 by Planning Department Preservation staff. All preparers meet the Secretary of the Interior’s
24 Professional Qualification Standards for historic preservation program staff, as set forth in
25 Code of Federal Regulations Title 36, Part 61, Appendix A. The report was reviewed for

1 accuracy and conformance with the purposes and standards of Article 10 of the Planning
2 Code. A copy of the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
3 Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference.

4 (4) The Historic Preservation Commission, at its regular meeting of May 20,
5 2026, reviewed Planning Department staff’s analysis of the historical significance of the Henry
6 Street Rowhouses set forth in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

7 (5) On May 20, 2026, after holding a public hearing on the proposed
8 designation and having considered the specialized analyses prepared by Planning
9 Department staff and the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet, the Historic Preservation
10 Commission recommended designation of the Henry Street Rowhouses as a landmark
11 consistent with the standards set forth in Section 1004 of the Planning Code, by Resolution
12 No. _____. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.
13 _____.

14 (6) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the Henry Street Rowhouses has
15 a special character and special historical, cultural, architectural, and aesthetic interest and
16 value, and that its designation as a landmark will further the purposes of and conform to the
17 standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code. In doing so, the Board of Supervisors
18 hereby incorporates by reference the findings of the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

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20 Section 2. Designation.

21 Pursuant to Section 1004.3 of the Planning Code, the Henry Street Rowhouses,
22 located at 191-197 Henry Street, Assessor’s Parcel Block No. 3540, Lot No. 092, is hereby
23 designated as a San Francisco landmark consistent with the standards set forth in Section
24 1004. Appendix A to Article 10 of the Planning Code is hereby amended to include this
25 property.

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Section 3. Required Data.

(a) The description, location, and boundary of the landmark site consists of the footprint of the Henry Street Rowhouses, located on Assessor’s Parcel Block No. 3540, Lot No. 092, on the south side of Henry Street between Castro Street and Noe Street in San Francisco’s Castro/Upper Market neighborhood, as shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

(b) The characteristics of the landmark that justify its designation are described and shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet and other supporting materials contained in Planning Department Record Docket No. 2026-001921DES. In brief, the Henry Street Rowhouses, located at 191-197 Henry Street, are eligible as a unique example of a rowhouse constructed in the Stick Eastlake style with intact features retaining a great deal of integrity. The property was constructed in 1892, at a time when Duboce Triangle was transitioning from an exurban neighborhood of large-lot Victorian Villas to a moderately populated, middle-class neighborhood. Factors witnessed in the mid-1860s, including the resolution of land titles, the completion of the Transcontinental railroad, and the extension of Market Street southwestward from Dolores to Castro Street, fostered an interest in land in Duboce Triangle and Eureka Valley. By the early 1890s, Duboce Triangle had lost most vestiges of its rural origins. The property is unique as an early example of rowhouses constructed during this transitional time in Duboce Triangle’s history.

(c) The particular features that should be preserved, or replaced in kind as determined necessary, are those generally shown in photographs and described in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet, which can be found in Planning Department Record Docket No. 2026-001917DES, and which are incorporated in this designation by reference as though fully set forth herein. This designation does not identify any interior character-defining features.

1 Specifically, the features that are character-defining and shall be preserved or replaced in kind
2 are the exterior elevations, form, massing, structure, rooflines, architectural ornament, and
3 materials of the property, identified as:

- 4 (1) Corner location of the building on the property with no front setback;
- 5 (2) Conjoined home configuration;
- 6 (3) Two-story height;
- 7 (4) Wood construction and horizontal wood siding;
- 8 (5) Hipped roof;
- 9 (6) North facing pediments with grille work and sunburst;
- 10 (7) Gabled entrance porticos with wooden ornamentation and wood columns on
11 center entranceway atop wooden steps;
- 12 (8) Denticulated cornice lines;
- 13 (9) Pedimented box bays, and second story corner bay with conical tower and finial;
14 and
- 15 10) Double hung wood windows with ogee lugs, some with decorative grids, with
16 flattened window surrounds, some decorative, and wood entry doors.

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18 Section 4. Effective Date.

19 This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after enactment. Enactment
20 occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or
21 does not sign the ordinance within 10 days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors
22 overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
