

1 [Accept and Expend Gift - San Francisco General Hospital Foundation - \$5,000,000 - Naming
2 Places in Priscilla Chan and Mark Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma
3 Center]

4 **Resolution authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and expend a**
5 **\$5,000,000 gift from the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation for the**
6 **procurement of furniture, fixtures, equipment and information technology for the**
7 **Priscilla Chan and Mark Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma**
8 **Center, and naming various places throughout the new acute care and trauma building**
9 **to recognize the donations that comprise the \$5,000,000 gift and earlier gifts from the**
10 **San Francisco General Hospital Foundation.**

12 WHEREAS, Priscilla Chan and Mark Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and
13 Trauma Center (“Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center”) is part of
14 the San Francisco Health Network managed and operated by the Director of Health
15 (“Director”) of the Department of Public Health (“Department”), for and on behalf of the City
16 and County of San Francisco (“City”); and

17 WHEREAS, Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center is the
18 heart of the City’s health care safety net, a community hospital with its doors open to all in
19 need, regardless of their ability to pay, thus the “Heart of Our City;” and

20 WHEREAS, Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center is located
21 in the Mission and serves more than 100,000 vulnerable San Franciscans each year; and

22 WHEREAS, Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center is the
23 City’s only trauma center serving San Francisco and Northern San Mateo counties, providing
24 comprehensive services to more than 4,000 trauma patients annually, and saving lives every
25 day; and

1 WHEREAS, Providing culturally competent care in more than 20 languages,
2 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center serves a diverse patient
3 population; and

4 WHEREAS, The generosity of private donors supplements the City's General Fund
5 contributions to help maintain Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma
6 Center's status as a world-class institution; and

7 WHEREAS, The San Francisco General Hospital Foundation, incorporated in 1993 as
8 an independent 501(c)3 charitable support organization exclusively for Zuckerberg San
9 Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center, plays a critical fundraising role raising in cash
10 contributions and pledges over \$220,000,000 in the past twenty years; and

11 WHEREAS, The San Francisco General Hospital Foundation's mission is to promote
12 excellence in research, education and care for all at Zuckerberg San Francisco General
13 Hospital and Trauma Center; and

14 WHEREAS, The San Francisco General Hospital Foundation's vision is to provide
15 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center with the financial resources
16 needed to ensure it remains the Heart of Our City and one of the nation's finest public
17 hospitals, delivering exceptional comprehensive health care and trauma services to anyone in
18 need; and

19 WHEREAS, By raising private support to augment public funding, the San Francisco
20 General Hospital Foundation is a model for successful public-private partnerships; and

21 WHEREAS, Funds raised by the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation are used
22 for patient services, facilities, equipment purchases, and for research efforts at Zuckerberg
23 San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center; and

24 WHEREAS, Gifts from the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation help support
25 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center's role as a training ground for

1 the next generation of compassionate nurses and physicians who are among the best in their
2 fields; and

3 WHEREAS, The San Francisco General Hospital Foundation has secured significant
4 pledges to support furniture, fixtures and equipment for the new Zuckerberg San Francisco
5 General Hospital and Trauma Center to enable the hospital to continue to provide excellent
6 medical care to the community, including trauma patients as well as the City's most vulnerable
7 residents; and

8 WHEREAS, It is customary and the philanthropic standard for both private or public
9 hospitals, to honor major gifts from private individuals by naming an entire hospital, hospital
10 and health system or a building or designated space within a building in recognition of the
11 donor; and

12 WHEREAS, On March 3, 2015, following the Health Commission's February 10, 2015,
13 recommendation, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 057-15, authorizing the
14 Department of Public Health to accept an initial gift totaling \$25,000,000 from the San
15 Francisco General Hospital Foundation from various donors to support the acquisition of
16 state-of-the-art furniture, fixtures and equipment for Zuckerberg San Francisco General
17 Hospital and Trauma Center's new acute care and trauma building; and

18 WHEREAS, The initial gift of \$25,000,000 from the San Francisco General Hospital
19 Foundation was comprised of several pledges that included naming of places throughout
20 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center's new acute care and trauma
21 building in recognition of the donations; and

22 WHEREAS, The San Francisco General Hospital Foundation is now donating
23 \$5,000,000 in celebration of its Heart of Our City Capital Campaign, from various donors to
24 support the acquisition of state-of-the-art furniture, fixtures and equipment for Zuckerberg San
25 Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center's new acute care and trauma building; and

1 WHEREAS, This gift is comprised of several pledges that include naming of places
2 throughout Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center’s new acute care
3 and trauma building in recognition of those donations; and

4 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Health Commission voted unanimously on October 20,
5 2015, to recommend to the Board of Supervisors to accept the \$5,000,000 gift from the San
6 Francisco General Hospital Foundation and approve the naming of various places throughout
7 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center’s new acute care and trauma
8 building in recognition of the donations that comprised the \$5,000,000 gift and the previous
9 \$25,000,000 gift; now, therefore, be it

10 RESOLVED, That in appreciation of their kind generosity and deep commitment to the
11 health of all San Franciscans, the Board of Supervisors is pleased to honor the donations that
12 comprised the initial \$25,000,000 gift from the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation
13 approved on March 3, 2015, by approving the naming of various places throughout
14 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center’s new acute care and trauma
15 building, as set forth below:

 16 Public Health to accept and expend a gift of cash in the value of up to \$5,000,000 donated to
 17 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center from the San Francisco
 18 General Hospital Foundation for furniture, fixtures, equipment, information technology and
 19 related services needed for the new Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma
 20 Center consistent with San Francisco Administrative Code, Section 10.100-305, regarding the
 21 acceptance of gifts to the City and County of San Francisco; and, be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That in appreciation of their kind generosity and deep
 23 commitment to the health of all San Franciscans, the Board of Supervisors is pleased to honor
 24 donors associated with the above-referenced \$5,000,000 gift and the remaining outstanding
 25

1 pledges in the amount of \$27,180,500 for a total of \$32,180,500 from the San Francisco
 2 General Hospital Foundation, by approving the naming of various places throughout
 3 Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center's new acute care and trauma
 4 building, as set forth above and below:

9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the naming
10 recognition for the Pediatric Care and Family Birth Center to stay in place until the end of the
11 useful life of the new Acute Care and Trauma Building (the "Building"), or earlier if Zuckerberg
12 San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center ceases providing dedicated space in the
13 Building for pediatric and obstetric healthcare services; and the name shall be the exclusive
14 name of the dedicated space in the Building for pediatric and obstetric healthcare services for
15 that period; and, be it

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, That for the purpose of the preceding paragraph, and subject
17 to the terms in the following paragraphs, the useful life of the Building shall end at the earliest
18 of (1) the demolition of the Building, (2) the renovation of 60% or more of the square footage
19 of the Building or the renovation of 60% or more of the square footage of the floor/story/level
20 of the Building where the dedicated space is located, (3) the conversion or redevelopment of
21 60% or more of the square footage of the Building to a primarily non-healthcare use, (4) the
22 abandonment or complete cessation of use of the Building, or (5) thirty years from when the
23 Building is placed in service; and, be it

24 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors may terminate any name
25 recognition described above in the unlikely event that (1) the donor does not fulfill the terms of

1 the pledge, including complete payment, associated with the name recognition, or (2) the
2 Board of Supervisors determines in its reasonable and good faith opinion that the naming
3 chosen for any designated space would adversely impact the reputation, image, mission or
4 integrity of the City, the Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital and Trauma Center, the
5 Health Commission, the Department, or the Board of Supervisors, in the event of a continued
6 association with the donor and/or the continuation of the naming provided for herein; the
7 Board of Supervisors may at its discretion, seek a recommendation from the Director of
8 Health prior to any such termination of the name recognition hereunder; and the Director of
9 Health will consult with the San Francisco General Hospital Foundation prior to making any
10 such recommendation; and, be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon any such termination of the name recognition as
12 described in the preceding paragraph, the City shall have no further obligations or liability to
13 the donor and shall not be required to return any portion of the gift or pledge already paid; the
14 Board of Supervisors, however, may in its sole and absolute discretion, determine an
15 alternative recognition for the portion of the gift or pledge already received, the Board of
16 Supervisors may at its discretion, seek a recommendation from the Director of Health prior to
17 any such alternative recognition, and the Director of Health will consult with the San Francisco
18 General Hospital Foundation prior to making any such recommendation.
