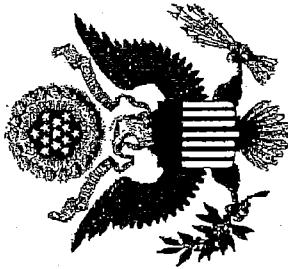

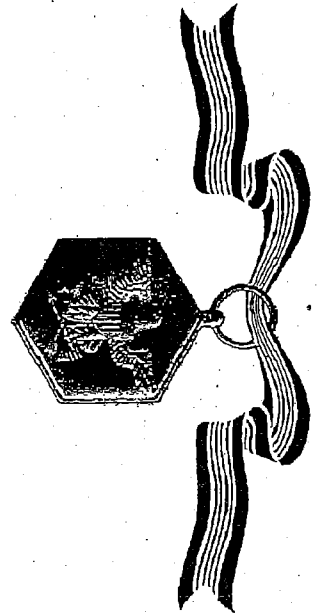
ACHIEVEMENT #2

NATURE, SCOPE AND EXTENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

As liaison officer I work with various departments of the San Francisco Office of Emergency Services, including Department of Public Health, to ensure that training partnerships are negotiated with the military. This was an outgrowth of my role as Weapons of Mass Destruction liaison for 2nd Medical Brigade. I ensure that Weapons of Mass Destruction training opportunities and information are shared between the military and Bay Area Metropolitan Medical Response Forces. I coordinated an Innovative Readiness Training project for medical support requested by San Francisco that required the approval from the Office of the Secretary of Defense, Reserves Affairs. I coordinate with the Region IX United States Public Health Service Emergency Coordinators, Federal Bureau of Investigation Weapons of Mass Destruction Coordinator, and Federal Emergency Management Agency Region IX Weapons of Mass Destruction Coordinator in my role as Weapons of Mass Destruction Liaison and have actively participated in their planning meetings and exercises. I represent both the San Francisco Medical Response System committee and 2nd Medical Brigade in Bay Area, Region IX all cities, and national Metropolitan Medical Response System meetings and exercises. This included being a panel member of the Patient Movement session during the 2001 National Disaster Management System conference. I have attended and participated in Bay Area Terrorism Working Group meetings and training exercises. I also ensure that memoranda of understanding are obtained and up-to-date for training programs, enabling military personnel to train in civilian sites.

As adjunct professor, I have been principal investigator for a research project on pregnant women at risk for preterm birth. The women in the study were from four private clinics in Oahu, Hawaii. I obtained research support from the University of Trier, West Germany to perform the salivary cortisol assays in their laboratory. Their salivary cortisol assays have served as the gold standard in the research community. I presented my research findings at conferences, including the Phyllis Verhonick Nursing Research Conference, United States Army Research Institute of Environmental Medicine meeting in Natick, Massachusetts; a Tripler Army Medical Center and University of Hawaii co-sponsored conference, and at the San Francisco State University Healthy People 2010 conference.

Board Qualifications:

The Veterans Affairs Commission consists of a total of seventeen members, twelve of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and five of whom are appointed by the Mayor as follows: Of the seventeen members, at least three must be women veterans (at least 2 members shall be appointed by the Board) and two members who served in the Armed Forces of the United States and who have a physical disability arising from that service (the Mayor and Board of Supervisors shall each appoint at least one member), in accordance with the definitions applied in such cases by the Veterans' Administration. All members shall reside in the City and County of San Francisco. The Board of Supervisors may only waive this requirement by ordinance.

The term of each member of the Commission shall be four years, provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that three members shall serve a one-year term, four members shall serve a two-year term, four members shall serve a three-year term and four members shall serve a four-year term. On the expiration of these and successive terms, their successors shall be appointed for a four-year term in a manner similar to that described for the initial members. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired portion of the term of the office vacated in a manner similar to that described for the initial members.

The Commission shall advise directly the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors on all matters affecting veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States of American, on the problems,

interests and needs of veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco and on the coordination of economic development, health care, and social services programs as they relate to veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco.

Reports: The Commission shall render annually a written report of its activities to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor.
