

1 [Participate in development of a system to provide early and accurate detection of biological
2 threats in San Francisco.]

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4 **Resolution authorizing the City and County of San Francisco, Department of Public**
5 **Health (SFDPH) to enter retroactively into an agreement in the amount of \$33,440 with**
6 **The Board of Trustees of the Leland Stanford Junior University (STANFORD), the**
7 **primary contractor, to participate in the development of a system to detect biological**
8 **threats; for the period of February 10, 2002 to February 11, 2003.**

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10 WHEREAS, STANFORD is the recipient of a contract from the Veridian Systems
11 Division for the project titled “A Bio-Surveilliance System for Advanced Medical Readiness”;
12 and,

13 WHEREAS, The services of SFDPH are necessary to assist STANFORD in the
14 performance of the contract; and,

15 WHEREAS, STANFORD has agreed to reimburse SFDPH in the amount of \$33,440
16 for rendering certain professional services for the performance of this contract; and,

17 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds STANFORD requires SFDPH to
18 enter into a Contract (The “Agreement”), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board
19 of Supervisors in File No. _____, which is hereby declared to be a part of this
20 resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

21 WHEREAS, The budget for this subcontract includes provision for indirect costs of
22 \$5,108; now, therefore, be it

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1 RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to enter retroactively into a subcontract
2 agreement in the amount of \$33,440 with STANFORD, the primary contractor, for services
3 under the project titled "A Bio-Surveillance System for Advanced Medical Readiness"; and, be
4 it

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the
6 agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

7 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the position funded
8 under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when the
9 agreement expires.
