

1 [Appointments, Immigrant Rights Commission - Kathleen Coll, Mario Paz, Angus McCarthy,
2 Felix Fuentes, Melba Maldonado, and Toye Moses]

3 **Motion appointing Kathleen Coll, Mario Paz, Angus McCarthy, Felix Fuentes, Melba**
4 **Maldonado, and Toye Moses, terms ending June 6, 2013, to the Immigrant Rights**
5 **Commission.**

8 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does
9 hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Immigrant
10 Rights Commission, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 211-97, for the terms
11 specified:

12 Kathleen Coll, seat 4, succeeding Melba Maldonado, term expired, must have a
13 demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or
14 employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco, for a two-year term
15 ending June 6, 2013.

16 Mario Paz (residency requirement waived), seat 6, succeeding Lorena Melgarejo,
17 resigned, must be an immigrant to the United States who is appointed in accordance with
18 Section 4.101 of the San Francisco Charter. In addition, the member shall have a
19 demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or
20 employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco, for a two-year term
21 ending June 6, 2013.

22 Angus McCarthy, seat 7, succeeding himself, term expired, must be an immigrant to
23 the United States who is appointed in accordance with Section 4.101 of the San Francisco
24 Charter. In addition, the member shall have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the

1 health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in
2 San Francisco, for a two-year term ending June 6, 2013.

3 Felix Fuentes, seat 8, succeeding himself, term expired, must be an immigrant to the
4 United States who is appointed in accordance with Section 4.101 of the San Francisco
5 Charter. In addition, the member shall have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the
6 health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in
7 San Francisco, for a two-year term ending June 6, 2013.

8 Melba Maldonado (residency requirement waived), seat 10, succeeding Ana Perez,
9 resigned, must be an immigrant to the United States who is appointed in accordance with
10 Section 4.101 of the San Francisco Charter. In addition, the member shall have a
11 demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or
12 employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco, for a two-year term
13 ending June 6, 2013.

14 Toye Moses, seat 11, succeeding himself, term expired, must be an immigrant to the
15 United States who is appointed in accordance with Section 4.101 of the San Francisco
16 Charter. In addition, members shall have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the
17 health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in
18 San Francisco, for a two-year term ending June 6, 2013; and, be it

19 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 20 1. The membership of the Immigrant Rights Commission has a goal to be
21 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 22 2. Applicants Mario Paz, a new appointee, and Melba Maldonado, a reappointment,
23 who are not residents of San Francisco, are persons with experience that uniquely
24 qualifies them to serve on the Immigrant Rights Commission.

1 3. The Immigrant Rights Commission has attempted to fill the positions, for which
2 Mario Paz and Melba Maldonado are nominated, with individuals who are City
3 residents and who have the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but have
4 been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Mario
5 Paz and Melba Maldonado are qualified to serve on the Immigrant Rights
6 Commission.

7 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there are no
8 other possible representatives, who are residents of San Francisco and who have
9 the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by these applicants, and
10 who are willing to serve on the Immigrant Rights Commission at this time; and, be it

11 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement
12 for Mario Paz and Melba Maldonado, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident,
13 willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires
14 person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative
15 act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
