7	Park Commission; directing the Commission to update its scholarship policy to
8	provide for further discounts for recreation programs based on financial need; making
9	certain clarifying changes; and affirming the Planning Department's determination
10	under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the 10 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board 11 12 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. 13 14 Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. 15 In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only (a) those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation 16 17 marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are 18 explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title 19 of the ordinance. 20 21 (b) The various codified fees presented as existing Code text in Section 2 of this ordinance do not necessarily reflect the fees that are currently applicable. Pursuant to Park 22 23 Code Section 12.20, the Controller adjusts those fees on an annual basis to reflect changes in 24 the Consumer Price Index. This ordinance is not intended to invalidate any adjustments under Section 12.20 that the Controller has previously approved. 25

1 (c) The current fees (including any Controller adjustments to those fees) 20 shall 2 continue to apply, until a cost recovery fee is set with approval of the Recreation and Park 3 Commission under the proposed Section 12.44. Further, the deletion of sections of the Park 4 Code referencing specific program fees in Section 2 of this ordinance does not mean that the 5 Department is prohibited from charging a fee for those programs. The intent of this ordinance 6 is to allow the Department to set fees for those programs under the proposed Section 12.44 7 instead.

8

9 Section 5. Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance, or any 10 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a 11 12 decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the 13 remaining portions or applications of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby 14 declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, 15 sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to 16 whether any other portion of this ordinance or application thereof would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional. 17

[Park Code - Recreation Program Fees]

Ordinance amending the Park Code to allow the Recreation and Park Department to set fees for recreation programs based on the Department's operating costs for those programs and various other factors, including whether the program is designated for youth, seniors, or persons with disabilities, subject to approval of the Recreation and Park Commission; directing the Commission to update its scholarship policy to provide for further discounts for recreation programs based on financial need; making certain clarifying changes; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

The Park Code sets fees for various recreation programs offered by the Recreation and Park Department.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would allow the Recreation and Park Department to set recreation program fees based on the estimated operating costs of those programs. The Department generally could set fees intended to cover the programs' full operating costs, but for programs designated for youth or seniors or persons with disabilities could set fees that recovered only 75% of the operating costs. In addition, the ordinance urges the Department to set fees for programs that benefit the community at large based on only 50% of the operating costs. All fees would require approval from the Recreation and Park Commission and once approved would be published on the Department's website.

The ordinance also directs the Recreation and Park Commission to update its scholarship policy to provide for further discounts for recreation programs based on financial need.

Background Information

The current recreation program fees would continue to apply pending the Department setting new fees based on cost recovery under the proposed ordinance.

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
