														TLC is extremely proactive with respect to bringing in wrap-around services as needed. Often, people who are unstably housed are also confronted by multiple challenges, and we collectively work to provide people the resources they need in order to mainfalm stable housing.		
														The vast majority of our clients earn under \$18,000 per year, and people who identify as white make up less than 30 percent of our clients. Only about 48 percent of our clients identify as straight, with the remainder either choosing not to identify, or
