URGING THE STATE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR TO APPROVE SENATE BILL 430

TO ASSIST LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IN COLLECTING UNPAID FEES, COSTS OR

CHARGES INCURRED IN THE ENFORCEMENT OF LOCAL ORDINANCES BY PLACING

LIENS AGAINST PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, Standards of building maintenance are meant to protect the safety of citizens against the dangers of earthquakes, fires, public nuisances and other hazards where they live and work; and,

WHEREAS, When applied professionally, without preference or favoritism, standards of building maintenance benefits the entire community; and,

WHEREAS, Property owners who fail to comply with building maintenance standards force California cities to spend millions of dollars in unreimbursed collection efforts; and,

WHEREAS, In many cases noncompliance is done knowingly and intentionally by property owners who risk the health and safety of the community for short-term economic gains; and,

WHEREAS, Many counties do not have sufficient funds to enforce code compliance or to recover associated costs; and,

WHEREAS, SB 430 would allow local officials to impose liens against properties with outstanding charges incurred in the enforcement of habitability standards, zoning ordinances, fire safety requirements and other State laws; and,

WHEREAS, SB 430 would give local officials an additional way to recover the costs of enforcing important safety standards; and,

WHEREAS, SB 430 would give property owners adequate time and opportunity to appear before a legislative body and be heard; and,

WHEREAS, Owner occupied, residential property would be exempted from this bill, maintaining the integrity of private dwellings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco endorses Senate Bill 430 and urges the State Legislature and Governor to approve the bill to assist local governments in collecting unpaid fees, costs or charges incurred in the enforcement of local ordinances by placing liens against property to ensure the health and safety of individuals and to conserve local resources.
