[Testing of Fire Resistant Intumescent Paint]

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUILDING INSPECTION AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

TO CONDUCT TESTS TO DETERMINE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF FIRE RESISTANT

INTUMESCENT PAINT.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department responded to nearly 1,700 structural fires between July 1998 and June 1999; and,

WHEREAS, According to the San Francisco Fire Department, there have been seven fire-related fatalities in San Francisco since the beginning of 1999; and,

WHEREAS, A rash of residential hotel fires has plagued San Francisco over the last several years leaving more than 600 of our most vulnerable residents without homes and driving up the price of remaining SRO rooms; and,

WHEREAS, In October, 1999, a tenant of a Mission District hotel lost her life in a hotel fire; and,

WHEREAS, In June, 1999 the University of California at Berkeley hosted a demonstration burn of one brand of fire resistant intumescent paint; and,

WHEREAS, The Berkeley burn suggests that fire resistant intumescent paint may have the ability to contain fire to the room of origin, giving people in a structure more time to escape and giving fire fighters more time to respond; and,

WHEREAS, At least some brands of intumescent paint reportedly emit far fewer fumes (Volatile Organic Chemicals or VOCs) than other paints and coatings; and,

WHEREAS, Intumescent paint can be easily applied to existing surfaces including ones that are already painted; and,

WHEREAS, One estimate indicates that the cost to paint a small room with intumescent paint is \$200, a relatively small price to pay to protect human lives; and,

WHEREAS, While intumescent paint should not be used as a replacement for required sprinklers or fire walls, it may be effective as a supplemental safety measure in San Francisco buildings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Department of Building Inspection and the Fire Department to conduct tests in a timely manner to determine the effectiveness of fire resistant intumescent paint in preventing injuries and property damage from fire; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the Department of Building Inspection and the Fire Department to use the results of the tests to evaluate whether fire resistant intumescent paint should be used by the City and County of San Francisco and incorporated in some way in City Building and Fire Codes; and, be it
