Resolution supporting Senate Bill 782 to provide stable, safe housing for victims of
domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking.
WHEREAS, Senate Bill 782 (Yee) would help provide stable, safe housing for victims
of domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking; and,
WHEREAS, Domestic violence is a widespread problem impacting one in three
households in the United States in all communities; and,
WHEREAS, Countless studies demonstrate that stable, safe housing is a public safety
issue, a critical element of ensuring the safety of domestic violence and stalking victims; and,
WHEREAS, Landlords sometimes evict domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking
victims based upon complaints of noise, fighting, or repeated visits from the police to a
victim's residence even though the visits are the result of crimes committed against the victim;
and,
WHEREAS, Safe housing is essential to recovery for victims of domestic violence;
and,
WHEREAS, SB 782 is modeled off of a San Francisco ordinance (File No. 020309),
which was unanimously supported by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors on February
10, 2009; and,
WHEREAS, SB 782 would provide that the conduct of the abuser may serve as a
defense to eviction of the victim tenant; now therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
supports SB 782, and urges the California Senate to pass SB 782, and urges the Governor to
sign SB 782 into law.
