7	No. 020) (the "Subject Property") for a stipulated assessed value of the Subject
8	Property of \$220,345,336 as of September 18, 2019, contingent upon the Assessment
9	Appeals Board's approval, and a refund of \$1,716,129 plus statutory interest; the first

20	Company, and CHSP San Francisco LLC, a Delaware Limited Liability Company, Plaintiffs;
