ending the Obama Administration and directing the Clerk of the etter of support with regard to the granting of Temporary Protected Status (TPS) to Haitians living in the United States.

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WHEREAS, A devastating earthquake, the worst in 200 years, struck Port-au-Prince on Tuesday January 12, 2010 laying waste to the city; and

WHEREAS, According to some estimates, more than 100,000 people have died, and an estimated three million people, or one third of the country's population, have been affected by this tragedy; and,

WHEREAS, The earthquake has toppled houses, hospitals, hotels, and other buildings leaving an untold number of people homeless and without access to food, water, or medical care: and.

WHEREAS, Currently 30,00 Haitians in the United States are facing deportation orders because they lack the proper documentation to stay in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Temporary Protected Status (TPS) was established by Congress in order to protect nationals of designated countries who are temporarily unable to return home safely because of ongoing armed conflicts, environmental disasters, or other extraordinary and temporary conditions; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Homeland Security has temporarily halted all deportations to Haiti, but the decision neither has a timetable nor allows Haitians to work. In contrast, designating Haiti for TPS would protect Haitians already in the United States by both halting deportations and allowing Haitian immigrants to secure work permits and send their earnings home to help Haiti to rebuild; and

WHEREAS, As the poorest country in the western Hemisphere, Haiti already depends significantly on remittances; TPS will enable Haitians in the United States to better support their families and their loved ones in Haiti; and

WHEREAS, Granting TPS will allow the Haitian government to better invest its limited resources in rebuilding damaged infrastructure and offer emergency relief to its suffering people; and

WHEREAS, TPS, instituted in tandem with comprehensive relief and development policies, will protect Haitians in the United States from being forcibly returned to an unsafe situation and will allow Haiti to recover from this crisis; now therefore, be it
