RE: Request to Process City and County of San Francisco's Fingerprint Identification Fees authorized by Vehicle Code 9250.19

Dear Karen Shorter:

On July 22, 2025, the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No. 133-25, authorizing an increase to the Fingerprint Identification fees (FID) under California Vehicle Code Section 9250.19.

As you know, Section 9250.19 authorizes a fee of \$2 to be paid to a county at the time of registration, renewal, or supplemental application for apportioned registration of every vehicle registered to an address within the county, plus an additional fee of \$4 for Commercial Vehicle Registration Act (CVRA) vehicles.

Please accept this letter as our formal request to program collection of \$2 per non-CVRA vehicle and \$6 per CVRA vehicle, effective six months from the date of this letter.

A copy of Ordinance No. 133-25 is enclosed with this letter.

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to authorize fees for vehicles registered to a San Francisco address to fund law enforcement programs related to fingerprint identification of persons involved in crimes committed while operating motor vehicles, in accordance with California State law, and to establish the Police Fingerprint

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. General Findings.

Identification Fund to receive the fee revenue.

- (a) California Vehicle Code Section 9250.19 (Section 9250.19) authorizes a fee of \$2 to be paid to a county at the time of registration, renewal, or supplemental application for apportioned registration of every vehicle registered to an address within the county, except those expressly exempted from payment of registration fees.
- (b) In addition to the \$2 fee, Section 9250.19 authorizes a fee of \$4 to be paid to a county for commercial motor vehicles subject to California Vehicle Code Section 9400.1 registered to an address within a county, totaling \$6 for commercial vehicles.
- (c) The Department of Motor Vehicles collects the fees authorized by Section 9250.19 at the time of vehicle registration and transmits the funds to the county. The county is authorized to expend funds allocated under Section 9250.19 exclusively for programs that

enhance the capacity of local law enforcement to provide automated mobile and fixed location fingerprint identification of individuals involved in crimes committed while operating a motor vehicle.

(d) The Police Department, in conjunction with the Sheriff's Department, operates an automated fingerprint identification system and desires to continue to support, enhance, and expand the system with funds collected under Section 9250.19.

Section 2. Chapter 10, Article XIII of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 10.100-173 to read as follows:

SEC. 10.100-173. POLICE FINGERPRINT IDENTIFICATION FUND.

- (a) Imposition of Fees. Pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 9250.19 (Section 9250.19), the City and County of San Francisco authorizes: (1) the imposition of a fee of \$2 to be paid at the time of registration or renewal of registration of every vehicle registered to an address within the City except those expressly exempted under State law; and (2) the imposition of an additional fee of \$4 to be paid at the time of registration or renewal of every commercial motor vehicle subject to California Vehicle Code Section 9400.1 registered to an address within the City.
- (b) Establishment of Fund. The Police Fingerprint Identification Fund is established as a category six fund to receive money collected under the California Department of Motor Vehicles' fees on vehicles registered to an address within the City pursuant to Section 9250.19, and authorized by subsection (a) of this Section 10.100-173.
- (c) Use of Fund. Consistent with Section 9250.19, the Chief of Police shall use monies in the fund exclusively to fund programs that enhance the capacity of local law enforcement to provide automated mobile and fixed location fingerprint identification of individuals who may be involved in driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs in violation of California Vehicle Code Sections 23152 or 23153, vehicular manslaughter in violation of California Penal Code Sections 191.5 or 192(c), or

any combination of those and other vehicle-related crimes. No costs which may be incurred by any City department in administering this fund shall be recovered therefrom.

Section 3. Effective Date and Operative Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. This ordinance shall not become operative until six months from the date that the Chief of Police certifies in writing to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors that the Department has complied with the submission requirement set forth in California Vehicle Code Section 9250.19.
