RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PENINSULA CORRIDOR JOINT POWERS BOARD TO INCREASE THE GRANT ANTICIPATION NOTE PROGRAM BY \$99,000,000 IN PRINCIPAL AMOUNT RESULTING IN A TOTAL AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$222,500,000

WHEREAS, The Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board, a joint exercise of powers agency established pursuant to the laws of the State of California (the "Joint Powers Board"), has proposed to increase the principal amount of its Grant Anticipation Note Program by \$99,000,000 (the "Notes") resulting in a total aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$222,500,000, pursuant to Section 6500 *et seq.* of the Government Code of the State of California, as amended and supplemented (the "Act"); and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco (the "City") is a member of the Joint Powers Board; and,

WHEREAS, The Notes will be issued from time to time to finance the costs of certain capital improvement projects related to the Joint Powers Board's Caltrain commuter rail service ("Caltrain"), including projects addressing station and intermodal access, mainline and right of way improvements, rolling stock and rehabilitation, operational and support facilities and equipment, and electrification EIR/PE, in advance of receipt of reimbursement from federal, state and local grants; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 6586.5 of the Act, the City is required: (i) to approve the financing, and (ii) to make a finding of significant public benefit in accordance with the criteria specified in Section 6586 of the Act after holding a public hearing; and,

WHEREAS, The Joint Powers Board has requested that the Board of Supervisors of the City (the "Board") approve the Notes in order to satisfy the requirements of Section 6586.5 of the Act; and,

WHEREAS, The projects to be financed with the Notes are located within the geographical boundary of the City and County of San Francisco, California; and,

WHEREAS, On or before February 16, 2000, the City caused a notice stating that a public hearing with respect to the issuance of the Notes would be held by the Mayor's Office on February 23, 2000, to appear in The Examiner, which is a paper of general circulation in the City; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Office has held the public hearing described above on February 23, 2000; and,

WHEREAS, This Board is the appropriate entity to approve the Notes within the meaning of Section 6586.5 of the Act; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THIS BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Board hereby finds and declares that the above recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. This Board hereby approves the Notes and hereby finds that: (i) the Notes as herein described will result in more efficient delivery of Member Agency services by the Joint Powers Board to residential and commercial development within the City; and (ii) serves a public purpose. It is the purpose and intent of this Board that this resolution constitute approval of the Notes in accordance with Section 6586.5 of the Act.

<u>Section 3</u>. The officers, employees and agents of the City are hereby authorized and directed, jointly and severally, to do any and all things to execute and deliver any and all documents which they deem necessary or advisable in order to carry out, give effect to and comply with the terms and intent of this resolution and the Notes approved hereby.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
